HOUSE BILL NO. 1493

- AN ACT TO CREATE SECTION 11-1-69, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
- 2 TO IMPOSE A LIMITATION ON THE AMOUNT OF NONECONOMIC DAMAGES THAT
- 3 MAY BE AWARDED IN A CIVIL ACTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** The following shall be codified as Section
- 6 11-1-69, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- 7 11-1-69. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited
- 8 as the "Noneconomic Damages Awards Act."
- 9 (2) For the purposes of this section, the following words
- 10 and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed herein unless the
- 11 context clearly requires otherwise:
- 12 (a) "Noneconomic Damages" means subjective,
- 13 nonpecuniary damages arising from death, pain, suffering,
- 14 inconvenience, physical impairment, disfigurement, mental anguish,
- 15 worry, emotional distress, loss of society and companionship, loss
- 16 of consortium, bystander injury, injury to reputation,
- 17 humiliation, loss of the enjoyment of life, hedonic damages, other
- 18 nonpecuniary damages, and any other theory of damages such as fear
- 19 of loss, illness, or injury.
- 20 (b) "Actual Economic Damages" means objectively
- 21 verifiable pecuniary damages arising from medical expenses and
- 22 medical care, rehabilitation services, custodial care,
- 23 disabilities, loss of earnings and earning capacity, loss of
- 24 income, burial costs, loss of use of property, costs of repair of
- 25 replacement of property, costs of obtaining substitute domestic
- 26 services, loss of employment, loss of business or employment
- 27 opportunities, and other objectively verifiable monetary losses.

- 28 (3) In any civil action, any compensatory damages award to a 29 prevailing plaintiff is limited to:
- 30 (a) Compensation for actual economic damages suffered
- 31 by the injured plaintiff; and
- 32 (b) Compensation for the noneconomic damages suffered
- 33 by the injured plaintiff not to exceed the amount of Two Hundred
- 34 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) or the amount awarded in
- 35 actual economic damages, whichever amount is greater.
- 36 (4) If liability is found, then the trier of fact, in
- 37 addition to other appropriate findings, shall make separate
- 38 findings specifying the total amount of noneconomic damages and
- 39 the total amount of actual economic damages for each separate
- 40 claimant in a manner that the court may apply the restrictions of
- 41 this section.
- 42 (5) The trier of fact shall not be advised of the
- 43 limitations imposed by this section.
- 44 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 45 and after July 1, 2002.
