HOUSE BILL NO. 1523

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-11-18.1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
- 2 TO INCLUDE SEXUAL MISCONDUCT AND INDECENT EXPOSURE IN THE
- 3 DEFINITION OF THE TERM "DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR" AS USED IN THE
- 4 STATUTE AUTHORIZING THE AUTOMATIC EXPULSION OF HABITUALLY
- 5 DISRUPTIVE STUDENTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-11-18.1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 37-11-18.1. (1) For the purposes of this section:
- 10 (a) The term "disruptive behavior" means conduct of a
- 11 student which is so unruly, disruptive or abusive that it
- 12 seriously interferes with a school teacher's or school
- 13 administrator's ability to communicate with the students in a
- 14 classroom, with a student's ability to learn, or with the
- 15 operation of a school or school-related activity, and which is not
- 16 covered by other laws related to violence or possession of weapons
- 17 or controlled substances on school property, school vehicles or at
- 18 school-related activities. Such behaviors include, but are not
- 19 limited to: foul, profane, obscene, threatening, defiant or
- 20 abusive language or action toward teachers or other school
- 21 employees; defiance, ridicule or verbal attack of a teacher;
- 22 sexual misconduct or indecent exposure; and willful, deliberate
- 23 and overt acts of disobedience of the directions of a teacher; and
- 24 (b) The term "habitually disruptive" refers to such
- 25 actions of a student which cause disruption in a classroom, on
- 26 school property or vehicles or at a school-related activity on
- 27 more than two (2) occasions during a school year, and to
- 28 disruptive behavior that was initiated, willful and overt on the

- 29 part of the student and which required the attention of school
- 30 personnel to deal with the disruption. However, no student shall
- 31 be considered to be habitually disruptive before the development
- 32 of a behavior modification plan for the student in accordance with
- 33 the code of student conduct and discipline plans of the school
- 34 district.
- 35 (2) Any student who is thirteen (13) years of age or older
- 36 for whom a behavior modification plan is developed by the school
- 37 principal, reporting teacher and student's parent and which
- 38 student does not comply with the plan shall be deemed habitually
- 39 disruptive and subject to automatic expulsion on the occurrence of
- 40 the third act of disruptive behavior during a school year. After
- 41 the second act of disruptive behavior during a school year by a
- 42 student who is younger than thirteen (13) years of age, a
- 43 psychological evaluation shall be performed upon the child.
- 44 (3) This section shall be repealed on July 1, 2003.
- 45 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 46 and after July 1, 2002.
