## HOUSE BILL NO. 1595

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 45-35-7, 63-1-43, 63-1-47 AND 2 63-1-82, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT DRIVERS' 3 LICENSES, IDENTIFICATION CARDS ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC 4 SAFETY AND ALL COMMERCIAL DRIVERS' LICENSES ISSUED TO PERSONS WHO 5 ARE NOT UNITED STATES CITIZENS SHALL EXPIRE ONE YEAR AFTER DATE OF 6 ISSUE; TO PRESCRIBE THE FEE FOR SUCH LICENSES; AND FOR RELATED 7 PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 45-35-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows:

11 45-35-7. (1) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this 12 section, each applicant for an original identification card issued 13 pursuant to this chapter who is entitled to issuance of such a 14 card shall be issued a four-year card. Each card shall expire at 15 midnight on the last day of the cardholder's birth month.

16 (2) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section,
17 all renewal identification cards shall be for four-year periods
18 and may be renewed any time during the birth month of the
19 cardholder upon application and payment of the required fee.

(3) (a) Any applicant who is blind, as defined in Section
43-6-1, upon payment of the fee prescribed in this section, shall
be issued an original identification card which shall remain valid
for a period of ten (10) years. All renewal identification cards
issued to such persons shall also be valid for a period of ten
(10) years.

26 (b) Any applicant who is not a United States citizen, 27 upon payment of the fee prescribed in this section, shall be 28 issued an original identification card which shall remain valid 29 for a period of one (1) year from date of issuance. All renewal 30 identification cards issued to such persons shall also be valid

31 for a period of one (1) year from date of issuance when

32 accompanied by required immigration documents.

(4) A fee of Eleven Dollars (\$11.00) <u>plus the applicable</u>
<u>photograph fee</u>, shall be collected for the issuance of an original
or renewal identification card, except that the fee for the
<u>issuance of an original or renewal identification card to a person</u>
<u>who is not a United States citizen shall be Three Dollars (\$3.00)</u>
plus the applicable photograph fee.

The Commissioner of Public Safety, by rule or regulation, 39 40 shall establish a driver's license photograph fee which shall be the actual cost of the photograph rounded off to the next highest 41 dollar. Monies collected for the photograph fee shall be 42 deposited into a special photograph fee account which the 43 Department of Public Safety shall use to pay the actual cost of 44 producing the photographs. Any monies collected in excess of the 45 46 actual costs of the photography shall be deposited to the General 47 Fund of the State of Mississippi. Such fee shall be deposited into the State General Fund. 48

49 (5) Any person who, for medical reasons, surrenders his unexpired driver's license, and any person whose unexpired 50 51 driver's license is suspended for medical reasons by the Commissioner of Public Safety under Section 63-1-53(e), may be 52 issued an identification card without payment of a fee. 53 The 54 identification card shall be valid for a period of four (4) years from its date of issue. All renewals of such card shall be 55 56 subject to the fee prescribed in subsection (4) of this section.

57 (6) The department shall maintain a record of all
58 identification cards issued, except for those cards cancelled,
59 surrendered or denied renewal.

60 **SECTION 2.** Section 63-1-43, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 61 amended as follows:

65 <u>(a)</u> Eighteen Dollars (\$18.00) plus the applicable 66 photograph fee for each applicant for a four-year license<u>;</u>

67 (b) Three Dollars (\$3.00) plus the applicable
68 photograph fee for each applicant for a one-year license, except
69 as provided in paragraph (c) of this subsection; and

70 (c) Eight Dollars (\$8.00) plus the applicable
71 photograph fee for a one-year license for each applicant who is
72 not a United States citizen.

All originals and renewals of regular operators' licensesshall be in compliance with Section 63-1-47.

75 (2) The fee for receiving the application and issuing a 76 motorcycle endorsement shall be Five Dollars (\$5.00). Motorcycle 77 endorsements shall be valid for the same period of time as the 78 applicant's operator's license.

(3) The fee for receiving the application and issuing a restricted motorcycle operator's license and the fee for renewing such license shall be Eleven Dollars (\$11.00) plus the applicable photograph fee. All originals and renewals of restricted motorcycle licenses shall be valid for a period of four (4) years, in compliance with Section 63-1-47.

From and after January 1, 1990, every person who makes 85 (4) 86 application for an original license or a renewal license to operate a vehicle as a common carrier by motor vehicle, taxicab, 87 88 passenger coach, dray, contract carrier or private commercial carrier as such terms are defined in Section 27-19-3, except for 89 those vehicles for which a Class A, B or C license is required 90 under Article 2 of this chapter, shall, in lieu of the regular 91 driver's license above provided for, apply for and obtain a Class 92 93 D commercial driver's license. Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5) of this section, the fee for the issuance of a 94

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95 <u>Class D commercial driver's license</u> shall be Twenty-three Dollars 96 (\$23.00) plus the applicable photograph fee for a period of four 97 (4) years; **\* \* \*** however, except as required under Article 2 of 98 this chapter, no driver of a pickup truck shall be required to 99 have a commercial license regardless of the purpose for which the 100 pickup truck is used.

Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5) of this 101 section, all originals and renewals of commercial licenses issued 102 103 under this section shall be valid for a period of four (4) years, in compliance with Section 63-1-47. Only persons who operate the 104 105 above-mentioned vehicles in the course of the regular and customary business of the owner shall be required to obtain a 106 107 Class D commercial operator's license, and persons operating such vehicles for private purposes or in emergencies shall not be 108 109 required to obtain such license.

The original and each renewal of a commercial driver's 110 (5) license issued under this section to a person who is not a United 111 112 States citizen shall be issued for a period of one (1) year for a fee of Thirteen Dollars (\$13.00) plus the applicable photograph 113 114 fee and shall expire on the date the licensee's immigration documents expire. A person who is not a United States citizen may 115 116 renew a commercial license issued under this section within two 117 (2) weeks before expiration of the license.

The Commissioner of Public Safety, by rule or 118 (6) 119 regulation, shall establish a driver's license photograph fee which shall be the actual cost of the photograph rounded off to 120 the next highest dollar. Monies collected for the photograph fee 121 shall be deposited into a special photograph fee account which the 122 Department of Public Safety shall use to pay the actual cost of 123 producing the photographs. Any monies collected in excess of the 124 125 actual costs of the photography shall be deposited to the General 126 Fund of the State of Mississippi.

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127 SECTION 3. Section 63-1-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 128 amended as follows:

129 63-1-47. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, 130 each applicant for an original license issued pursuant to this 131 article, who is entitled to issuance of same, and who is eighteen 132 (18) years of age or older, shall be issued a four-year license 133 which will expire at midnight on the licensee's birthday.

(a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, all
renewal licenses of operators eighteen (18) years of age or older
shall be for four-year periods and may be renewed any time within
six (6) months before the expiration of the license upon
application and payment of the required fee, unless required to be
reexamined.

(b) From and after January 1, 1990, no commercial 140 driver's license shall be issued under the provisions of this 141 article for any commercial motor vehicle, the lawful operation of 142 which requires the driver to obtain a Class A, B or C commercial 143 144 driver's license under Article 2 of this chapter; however, from time to time, the holder of a commercial license may apply for a 145 commercial driver's license under Article 2 of this chapter; and, 146 147 if he fails to pass the required test for such license, he shall be entitled to an extension of his license that shall be valid for 148 one hundred twenty (120) days or until he again is tested under 149 Article 2 of this chapter, whichever occurs first. 150 The extension 151 shall entitle the license holder to operate all vehicles which such license authorized him to operate prior to taking the 152 required test. The first extension shall be without charge; 153 however, a fee of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) shall be imposed for 154 any subsequent extension. No extension shall be valid past March 155 156 31, 1992.

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158 (2) Any commercial driver's license issued under this 159 article before January 1, 1990, which expires after March 31,

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1992, shall be void on April 1, 1992, for the operation of any 160 commercial vehicle requiring a commercial license to be issued 161 under Article 2 of this chapter; however, if the holder of any 162 163 such license applies for a commercial driver's license under 164 Article 2 of this chapter, passes the required tests for such license, pays all applicable fees under Article 2 of this chapter 165 except the Forty Dollars (\$40.00) license fee and otherwise meets 166 all requirements for the issuance of such license, then such 167 person shall be issued a license under Article 2 of this chapter 168 which shall expire on the expiration date of the commercial 169 170 driver's license being replaced.

171 (3) The fee for the issuance of an original and renewals of 172 <u>a Class D commercial driver's license under this article to an</u> 173 <u>applicant who is not a United States citizen and the period for</u> 174 <u>which such license will be valid and expire shall be as prescribed</u> 175 in Section 63-1-43.

The Commissioner of Public Safety shall notify, by 176 (4) 177 United States mail addressed to the last known address of record with the Department of Public Safety, all holders of a commercial 178 179 driver's license issued under this article before January 1, 1990, and which expire after March 31, 1992, that such license will be 180 void on and after April 1, 1992, for the operation of any vehicle 181 for which a commercial driver's license is required to be issued 182 under Article 2 of this chapter. 183

184 Any person holding a valid commercial driver's license (5) issued under this article before January 1, 1990, shall continue 185 186 thereafter, until expiration of such license, to be entitled to operate all vehicles which such license authorized him to operate 187 immediately before January 1, 1990, except that from and after 188 April 1, 1992, such license shall not entitle the licensee to 189 operate a commercial motor vehicle the lawful operation of which 190 191 requires a commercial driver's license under Article 2 of this

192 chapter.

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(6) Except as otherwise provided in this article, each 193 applicant for an original driver's license issued pursuant to this 194 article, who is entitled to issuance of same, being under eighteen 195 196 (18) years of age, shall be issued a one-year license which will 197 expire at midnight on the licensee's birthday. Renewal drivers' licenses of operators under the age of eighteen (18) shall be for 198 one-year periods and may be renewed any time within two (2) months 199 200 before the expiration of the license upon application and payment of the required fee, unless required to be reexamined. 201 An intermediate license shall be valid for one (1) year from its date 202 203 of issue and may be renewed any time within fourteen (14) days before expiration of the license. All applications by an operator 204 205 under the age of eighteen (18) must be accompanied by 206 documentation that the applicant is in compliance with the education requirements of Section 63-1-9(1)(g); the documentation 207 208 must be dated no more than thirty (30) days prior to the date of 209 application.

210 **SECTION 4.** Section 63-1-82, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 211 amended as follows:

63-1-82. (1) Each commercial driver's license shall be marked "Commercial Driver's License" or "CDL," and shall, to the maximum extent practicable, be tamper proof. Each such license shall include thereon, but not be limited to, the following information:

(a) The name and residential address of the licensee;
(b) The licensee's color photograph;
(c) A physical description of the licensee, including
his sex, height, weight, eye and hair color;

The licensee's date of birth;

(e) Except for a nonresident commercial driver's
license, the licensee's social security number; and any other
identifying information which the Commissioner of Public Safety,

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(d)

by rule or regulation, determines necessary and essential for the purposes of complying with the provisions of this article;

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(f) The licensee's signature;

(g) The class or type of commercial motor vehicle or vehicles which the licensee is authorized to drive together with any endorsements or restrictions;

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(h) The name of this state; and

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(i) The dates between which the license is valid.

(2) The holder of a valid commercial driver's license may
drive all vehicles in the class for which that license is issued
and all lesser classes of vehicles, including any vehicle for
which an operator's license or commercial driver's license issued
under Article 1 of this chapter authorizes a person to drive.
However, vehicles which require an endorsement may not be driven
unless the proper endorsement appears on the license.

(3) Commercial <u>drivers'</u> licenses may be issued with the
 following classifications:

(a) Class A. Any combination of vehicles with a gross
vehicle weight rating of twenty-six thousand one (26,001) pounds
or more, provided the gross vehicle weight rating of the vehicle
or vehicles being towed is in excess of ten thousand (10,000)
pounds;

(b) Class B. Any single vehicle with a gross vehicle
weight rating of twenty-six thousand one (26,001) pounds or more,
and any such vehicle towing a vehicle not in excess of ten
thousand (10,000) pounds;

(c) Class C. Any single vehicle with a gross vehicle
weight rating of less than twenty-six thousand one (26,001) pounds
or any such vehicle towing a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight
rating not in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds comprising:
(i) Vehicles designed to transport sixteen (16) or
more passengers, including the driver; and

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(ii) Vehicles used in the transportation of hazardous materials which are required to be placarded under the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act, 49 USCS Appx., Section 1801 et seq.; and

(d) Class D. All other vehicles or combination of
vehicles which are not included in Class A, Class B or Class C and
for which a commercial license is required to be issued as
provided by Section 63-1-43, Mississippi Code of 1972.

265 (4) Commercial <u>drivers'</u> licenses may be issued with the 266 following endorsements and restrictions:

267 (a) "H" authorizes the driver to drive a vehicle268 transporting hazardous materials;

(b) "K" restricts the driver to vehicles not equippedwith air brakes;

(c) "T" authorizes driving double and triple trailers;
(d) "P" authorizes driving vehicles carrying
passengers;

274 (e) "N" authorizes driving tank vehicles; \* \* \*

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(f) "X" represents a combination of hazardous materials

276 and tank vehicle endorsements; and

(g) "S" restricts the driver to school buses being operated for the purpose of transporting pupils to and from school or to school-related functions and/or to all other vehicles not requiring a commercial driver's license.

(5) Before issuing a commercial driver's license, the
Commissioner of Public Safety shall obtain driving record
information through the Commercial Driver License Information
System.

(6) Within ten (10) days after issuing a commercial driver's
license, the Commissioner of Public Safety shall notify the
Commercial Driver License Information System of that fact,
providing all information required to ensure identification of the
person.

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Except as provided in subsection (10) of this section, 290 (7) 291 the fee charged for the issuance of each original and each renewal of a Class A, B or C commercial driver's license shall be 292 293 Thirty-eight Dollars (\$38.00) plus the applicable photograph fee. 294 In addition, a fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be charged for each endorsement or restriction entered on a commercial driver's 295 license under subsection (4) of this section. However, the fee 296 charged for each original and renewal of a commercial driver's 297 license with an "S" restriction shall be the same as the fee for a 298 Class D commercial driver's license in addition to all application 299 300 fees.

(8) If a commercial driver instruction permit or commercial 301 302 driver's license is lost or destroyed, or if the holder of a commercial driver's license changes his name, mailing address or 303 residence, an application for a duplicate permit or license shall 304 305 be made as provided by Section 63-1-37, Mississippi Code of 1972. Except as provided in subsection (10) of this section, 306 (9) 307 all commercial drivers' licenses issued under the provisions of

308 this article shall be issued for a period of not more than four 309 (4) years and shall expire at midnight on the last day of the 310 licensee's month of birth.

The original and each renewal of a commercial driver's 311 (10)license issued under this section to a person who is not a United 312 States citizen shall be issued for a period of one year for a fee 313 314 of Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) plus the applicable photograph fee and shall expire on the date the licensee's immigration documents 315 316 expire. Such person may renew a commercial license issued under this section within two (2) weeks before expiration of the 317 318 license.

319 <u>(11)</u> Every person applying for renewal of a commercial 320 driver's license shall complete the application form required by 321 Section 63-1-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, providing updated 322 information and required certifications and paying the appropriate

326 (12) The Commissioner of Public Safety, by rule or 327 regulation, shall establish a driver's license photograph fee which shall be the actual cost of the photograph rounded off to 328 the next highest dollar. Monies collected for the photograph fee 329 shall be deposited into a special photograph fee account which the 330 Department of Public Safety shall use to pay the actual cost of 331 producing the photographs. Any monies collected in excess of the 332 actual costs of the photography shall be deposited to the General 333 Fund of the State of Mississippi. 334

335 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 336 and after July 1, 2002.
