HOUSE BILL NO. 1609

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 3-3-16, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 PROHIBIT THE ALTERATION OF CERTAIN HISTORICAL STATUES, MONUMENTS, 2 3 MEMORIALS AND NAMEPLATES; TO PROVIDE THAT THOSE HISTORICAL 4 STATUES, MONUMENTS, MEMORIALS AND NAMEPLATES AND THE OFFICIAL STATE FLAG MAY BE CHANGED ONLY UPON THE ENACTMENT OF LEGISLATION 5 AMENDING THIS CODE SECTION THAT HAS RECEIVED A TWO-THIRDS VOTE OF 6 7 THE LEGISLATURE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 8 SECTION 1. Section 3-3-16, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 9 10 amended as follows: 3-3-16. (1) The official flag of the State of Mississippi 11 shall have the following design: with width two-thirds (2/3) of 12 its length; with the union (canton) to be square, in width 13 two-thirds (2/3) of the width of the flag; the ground of the union 14 15 to be red and a broad blue saltire thereon, bordered with white and emblazoned with thirteen (13) mullets or five-pointed stars, 16

17 corresponding with the number of the original States of the Union; 18 the field to be divided into three (3) bars of equal width, the 19 upper one blue, the center one white, and the lower one, extending 20 the whole length of the flag, red (the national colors); this 21 being the flag adopted by the Mississippi Legislature in the 1894 22 Special Session.

## 23 (2) None of the following items, structures or areas may be 24 relocated, removed, disturbed, altered, renamed or rededicated: 25 Any Revolutionary War, War of 1812, Mexican War, War Between the 26 States, Spanish-American War, World War I, World War II, Korean

27 War, Vietnam War, Persian Gulf War, Native-American or

28 African-American historical statue, monument, memorial or

29 nameplate, which has been erected on public property of the state

30 or any of its political subdivisions; and any statue, monument, memorial, nameplate, street, bridge, building, park, preserve, 31 reserve or other public item, structure or area of the state or 32 any of its political subdivisions, which has been dedicated in 33 34 memory of or named for any historical figure or historical event. 35 No person may prevent the public body responsible for maintaining any of the items, structures or areas described above 36 from taking proper measures and exercising proper means for the 37 protection, preservation and care of those items, structures or 38 39 areas. 40 The provisions of this section may be amended or (3) repealed only upon passage of an act that has received a 41 two-thirds (2/3) vote on final passage in each house of the 42 Legislature. 43 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 44 and after July 1, 2002. 45
