5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be

8	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the commission, for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003.

11	SECTION 2. With the funds appropriated under the provisions
12	of Section 1, the following positions are authorized:

18	Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation
19	Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase

23	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
24	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to

- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- Of the above funds, none may be expended by this act to provide for any regulatory authority over livestock auctioneers conducting sales for an individual of his own property.
