AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING 1 THE EXPENSES OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2 3 2003. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of 7 defraying the expenses of the State Department of Health for the 8 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003..... 9 30,715,240.00.\$ 10 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special 12 13 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Department of Health which is comprised of special source funds collected by 14 15 or otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the department for the fiscal year 16 beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003..... 17\$ 172,676,661.00. 18 SECTION 3. Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase equal to fifty percent (50%) of the realignment component of the Variable Compensation Plan or Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00), whichever is greater, beginning on January 1, 2003.

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 70 71 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 72 Services" for Fiscal Year 2004 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2003 73 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs, positions or 74 75 pay increases are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi 76 Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall, on July 1, 2002, publish 77 78 separate annual projection reports, based on July 1, 2002 data, for the period of July 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002, and 79 80 January 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003, that project the annual cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with 81 82 the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases 83 this projected cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2003 appropriation for 84 85 "Personal Services," as annualized on a semi-annual basis in accordance with the provisions of this act. If, at the end of any 86 calendar month, the State Personnel Board determines that the 87 agency has taken action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed 88 this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2003 "Personal 89 Services" appropriated level, when annualized in compliance with 90 the provisions of this act, then only those actions which reduce 91 92 the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance withthe terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

97 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 98 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 99 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 100 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for Fiscal Year 2004.

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Department of Health may escalate any special funds and positions not to exceed Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00). Such escalation shall be submitted to and approved by the Department of Finance and Administration in the manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 144 145 Department of Health shall have the authority to expend any special funds collected or otherwise available, notwithstanding 146 147 any restrictions in the general law or statutes earmarking said funds for a particular use, that are in excess of the amounts 148 needed for the purpose of such fund, for the purpose of providing 149 150 maternal and child health, family planning and disease control services. 151

152 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that with 153 the funds provided herein, the State Department of Health may 154 provide and administer without charge, Hepatitis B vaccinations to 155 Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel who are in need of such 156 vaccinations through job related exposure.

157 **SECTION 9.** In addition to all other sums heretofore 158 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be

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necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 159 Treasury to the credit of the Local Governments and Rural Water 160 Systems Emergency Loan Fund, and the Local Governments and Rural 161 162 Water System Improvements Revolving Loan Fund as authorized in 163 Chapter 521, Laws of 1995, to the State Department of Health for 164 the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Local Governments and Rural Water Systems Improvements Board, for the fiscal year 165 beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003..... 166 167 \$ 33,552,000.00

168 **SECTION 10.** It is the intention of the Legislature that in 169 the event that there are insufficient Child Care Development Block 170 Grant Funds, then the Department of Health shall maintain the 171 Child Care Licensure Program at the same level that the program 172 was in Fiscal Year 1993 using any other funds.

SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One 173 Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall come from the Department of 174 Human Services, Child Care Development Fund or other appropriate 175 176 special funds for the purpose of child care licensure. These funds are to be transferred to the State Department of Health no 177 178 later than July 31, 2002. The State Department of Health shall make a complete accounting of the uses of these funds to the 179 Department of Human Services. 180

It is the intention of the Legislature that the SECTION 12. 181 State Department of Health shall expend not more than Fifty 182 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) of the funds appropriated in Section 183 1 and allocated in Section 4 for providing the oil known as 184 "Lorenzo's Oil" for the treatment of the genetic disorder 185 adrenoleukodystrophy (ALD), to children and Mississippi residents 186 over the age of twenty-one (21) who have the genetic disorder 187 adrenoleukodystrophy and for whom Medicaid does not reimburse the 188 cost of providing the oil. The department may also provide needed 189 190 pathology and biannual MRI exams.

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SECTION 13. In addition to all other funds heretofore 191 192 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 193 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money deposited in 194 the State Treasury from the Mississippi Tobacco Pilot Program as 195 authorized in the case Mike Moore Attorney General ex rel. State 196 of Mississippi v. The American Tobacco Company et al. (Chancery Court of Jackson County, Mississippi, Cause No. 94-1429) to the 197 State Department of Health for the fiscal year beginning 198 July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003..... \$ 8,000,000.00. 199 It is the intention of the Legislature that of the funds 200 201 appropriated in this section, an amount of Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,500,000.00) is provided to fund the 202 203 School Tobacco Nurse Program.

SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00) are provided for the purpose of purchasing AIDS drugs only and not for educational purposes.

SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated in Section 3, the amounts of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$125,000.00) shall be allocated to the T. K. Martin Center at Mississippi State University and One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$125,000.00) shall be allocated to the Regional Rehabilitation Center in Tupelo for the Early Intervention Program.

214 **SECTION 16.** Of the funds appropriated herein, Fifty Thousand 215 Dollars (\$50,000.00) is provided for the Osteoporosis Program.

SECTION 17. In addition to all other funds heretofore appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Department of Health which is comprised of special source funds collected by or otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of funding the Federal Bioterrorism Preparedness Program to the State

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Department of Health for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, 223 and ending June 30, 2003.....\$ 12,300,000.00. 224 SECTION 18. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 225 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 226 227 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 228 229 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 230 SECTION 19. This act shall take effect and be in force from 231 and after July 1, 2002. 232
