1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2003.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003
10	\$ 12,202,077.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of
14	Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source
15	funds collected by or otherwise available to the department for
16	the support and maintenance of the department, for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003
18	\$ 44,122,402.00.
19	The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
20	above in this section, is hereby appropriated out of the state
21	excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to
22	the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning
23	July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003 \$5,750,000.00.
24	The State Tax Commission is hereby directed to set aside the
25	amount of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it
26	sees fit, out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and
27	other petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside

28	from such funds before making distribution thereof. However,
29	provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund,
30	as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and
31	any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of
32	1972.
33	Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be
34	expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as
35	authorized by law during Fiscal Year 2003.
36	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
37	Section 2 and allocated in Section 5 to the Bureau of Wildlife and
38	Fisheries, funds in the amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand
39	Three Hundred Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived
40	from the Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections
41	27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose
42	of defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2003.
43	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
44	Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
45	authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and
46	Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Three Hundred Fifty
47	Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00) for the purpose of preservation,
48	protection, conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and
49	wildlife of this state.
50	SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
51	Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall
52	be expended for the respective major objects of such divisions:

the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 158 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 159 160 Services" for Fiscal Year 2004 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2003 161 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs, positions or pay increases are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi 162 Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget 163 Office, the State Personnel Board shall, on July 1, 2002, publish 164 separate annual projection reports, based on July 1, 2002 data, 165 for the period of July 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002, and 166 167 January 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003, that project the annual cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with 168 169 the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases 170 this projected cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2003 appropriation for 171 "Personal Services," as annualized on a semi-annual basis in 172 accordance with the provisions of this act. If, at the end of any 173 174 calendar month, the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed 175 176 this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2003 "Personal Services" appropriated level, when annualized in compliance with 177 178 the provisions of this act, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement 179 will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as 180 181 the requirements of this provision are met. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Executive 182 Director of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may 183 transfer between the various divisions authorized herein both 184 funds and positions not to exceed five percent (5%) of the 185 186 authorized budgets in the aggregate. The Executive Director of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall submit 187 188 written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget 189 Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or H. B. No. 1793

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of

190 before the fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of 191 the transfer.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

The board of supervisors of any county or any SECTION 6. group or combination of counties are hereby authorized and empowered to enter into cooperative agreements with each other and with the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the purpose of creating, improving or restoring parks, public game and fish habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within such county or in an adjoining county; and each county is empowered and authorized, in its discretion, to expend a sum not exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) from the general county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall reimburse to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the actual cost of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental thereto. Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and empowered, in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary to carry out the purposes of this act with any other county, the United States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for such purposes. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to lease all woodlands now existing on the O'Keefe Division of the Department of Corrections for use of a game preserve and refuge, upon such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks and the Department of Corrections.

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SECTION 7. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks 222 is hereby directed to keep an exact accounting of the funds 223 received during each fiscal year by fund and source and an exact 224 225 accounting of how these funds were expended by fund and 226 program/division. Such information shall be provided to the House and Senate Appropriations Chairmen, Chairman of the House Game and 227 Fish Committee and Chairman of the Senate Wildlife and Fisheries 228 229 Committee no later than October 1 following the end of the fiscal 230 year. SECTION 8. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks 231 232 is authorized to enter into an agreement with the Pearl River Valley Water Supply District to provide for financial support of 233 an additional conservation officer on and around the Ross Barnett 234 235 Reservoir. The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to 236 escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and 237 238 Parks for this purpose. 239 SECTION 9. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use of 240 241 any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for 242 243 any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of 244 Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof. It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles 245 246 authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972. 247 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 248 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the 249 250 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from any source, not 251 to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00), that may become available to the department in accordance with the rules 252

and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration.

None of the funds authorized in this section shall be used to

257	SECTION 11. In compliance with the "Mississipp	i Performance
258	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is th	e intent of
259	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall	be utilized

261	intended mission of this agency. Based on the fundi	ng authorized,

293	SECTION 12. In order to be in compliance with Sections
294	63-1-74 through 63-1-79, funds are herein provided and may be
295	expended by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay
296	the costs of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees
297	and/or to reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the
298	course of their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold
299	a valid Mississippi Commercial Driver's License.
300	SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
301	Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
302	authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Mississippi
303	Development Authority in the amount of Four Million Dollars
304	(\$4,000,000.00) as authorized in Section 57-61-32 (1), Mississippi
305	Code of 1972. Such funds are to be used to defray the cost of
306	constructing a North Mississippi Fish Hatchery.
307	SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the
308	following amounts shall come from:
309	Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks Special Duck
310	Stamp Fund No. 3470, for the purpose of protecting and propagating
311	migratory waterfowl in accordance with Section 49-7-167,
312	Mississippi Code of 1972 \$ 500,000.00
313	Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks Special Timber
314	Fund No. 3469, for the purpose of acquiring real estate for the
315	State of Mississippi which will be used to provide hunting and/or

327	SECTION 15. Of the funds provided herein, One Hundred Fifty
328	Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) is provided to the Department of
329	Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the enhancement of marketing of
330	state parks.
331	SECTION 16. The Mississippi Department of Wildlife,
332	Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of
333	One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) and to enter into
334	an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service
335	for a biology specialist and related supportive cost.
336	The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to
337	escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and
338	Parks for this purpose.
339	SECTION 17. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
340	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
341	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
342	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
343	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
344	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
345	SECTION 18. This act shall take effect and be in force from
346	and after July 1, 2002.
