HOUSE BILL NO. 1793 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND 1 MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS FOR 2 3 THE FISCAL YEAR 2003. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and 7 maintenance of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for 8 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003 9 12,059,057.00. 10 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special 12 13 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source 14 funds collected by or otherwise available to the department for 15 the support and maintenance of the department, for the fiscal year 16 beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003..... 17 18 \$ 44,554,337.00. The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated 19 above in this section, is hereby appropriated out of the state 20 21 excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning 22 July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003..... \$5,750,000.00. 23 The State Tax Commission is hereby directed to set aside the 24 amount of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it 25 26 sees fit, out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside 27

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28 from such funds before making distribution thereof. However,

29 provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund, 30 as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and 31 any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of 32 1972.

Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as authorized by law during Fiscal Year 2003.

SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2 and allocated in Section 5 to the Bureau of Wildlife and Fisheries, funds in the amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived from the Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2003.

43 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 44 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the 45 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and 46 Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Three Hundred Fifty 47 Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00) for the purpose of preservation, 48 protection, conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and 49 wildlife of this state.

50 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 51 Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall 52 be expended for the respective major objects of such divisions:

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Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase equal to fifty percent (50%) of the realignment component of the Variable Compensation Plan or Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00), whichever is greater, beginning on January 1, 2003.

195 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 196 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 197 Services" for Fiscal Year 2004 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2003 198 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs, positions or 199 200 pay increases are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget 201 Office, the State Personnel Board shall, on July 1, 2002, publish 202 separate annual projection reports, based on July 1, 2002, data, 203 for the period of July 1, 2002, through December 31, 2002, and 204 January 1, 2003, through June 30, 2003, that project the annual 205 cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with 206 207 the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases 208 209 this projected cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2003 appropriation for "Personal Services," as annualized on a semiannual basis in 210 211 accordance with the provisions of this act. If, at the end of any calendar month, the State Personnel Board determines that the 212 agency has taken action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed 213 214 this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2003 "Personal Services" appropriated level, when annualized in compliance with 215 216 the provisions of this act, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement 217 will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as 218 the requirements of this provision are met. 219

It is the intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may transfer between the various divisions authorized herein both

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funds and positions not to exceed five percent (5%) of the authorized budgets in the aggregate. The Executive Director of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the transfer.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, and allocated to the Special Projects budget in Section 5, the following amounts shall come from:

Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks Special Timber Fund No. 3469, for the purpose of acquiring real estate for the State of Mississippi which will be used to provide hunting and/or fishing activities.....\$2,000,000.00

257 SECTION 7. The board of supervisors of any county or any 258 group or combination of counties are hereby authorized and 259 empowered to enter into cooperative agreements with each other and 260 with the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the purpose of creating, improving or restoring parks, public game and 261 262 fish habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within such county or in an adjoining county; and each county is 263 264 empowered and authorized, in its discretion, to expend a sum not exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) from the 265 266 general county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall 267 reimburse to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the 268 actual cost of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental 269 Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and 270 thereto. 271 empowered, in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary to carry out the purposes of this act with any other county, the 272 273 United States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for 274 275 such purposes.

SECTION 8. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks 276 is hereby directed to keep an exact accounting of the funds 277 278 received during each fiscal year by fund and source and an exact accounting of how these funds were expended by fund and 279 280 program/division. Such information shall be provided to the House and Senate Appropriations Chairmen, Chairman of the House Game and 281 Fish Committee and Chairman of the Senate Wildlife and Fisheries 282 283 Committee no later than October 1 following the end of the fiscal 284 year.

285 **SECTION 9.** The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks 286 is authorized to enter into an agreement with the Pearl River

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The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for this purpose.

SECTION 10. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.

It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.

302 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the 303 304 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from any source, not 305 to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00), that may 306 become available to the department in accordance with the rules 307 and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration. 308 None of the funds authorized in this section shall be used to increase the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and 309 Fringe Benefits." 310

311 SECTION 12. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 312 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 313 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 314 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 315 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, 316 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted 317 performance measures provided below:

354 SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 355 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the 356 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Mississippi 357 Development Authority in the amount of Four Million Dollars 358 (\$4,000,000.00) as authorized in Section 57-61-32 (1), Mississippi 359 Code of 1972. Such funds are to be used to defray the cost of 360 constructing a North Mississippi Fish Hatchery.

361 **SECTION 15.** Of the funds provided herein, One Hundred Fifty 362 Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) is provided to the Department of 363 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the enhancement of marketing of 364 state parks.

365 **SECTION 16.** The Mississippi Department of Wildlife, 366 Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of 367 One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) and to enter into 368 an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service 369 for a biology specialist and related supportive cost.

The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for this purpose.

373 **SECTION 17.** The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks 374 is authorized to maintain the following job classes as non-state 375 service: DWFP - Enforcement Trainee (Cadet), Special Operations 376 Agent I, Special Operations Agent II and Special Operations Agent 377 III.

378 **SECTION 18.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 379 of Sections 1 and 2, so much as necessary shall be used to create 380 a DWFP Assistant Hatchery Manager at the Lyman Hatchery using 381 existing positions in the Wildlife and Fisheries budget.

382 **SECTION 19.** With the funds appropriated herein, the 383 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to make

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384 payment for the following invoices from previous fiscal years as 385 follows:

SECTION 20. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2, Budget Contingency Funds in the amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) are provided for the purpose of purchasing and erecting a memorial sign to be located in Front Street Park in Durant honoring the Mississippians killed in the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks upon the United States of America.

SECTION 21. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 394 395 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 396 397 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 398 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 399 SECTION 22. This act shall take effect and be in force from 400 401 and after July 1, 2002.
