Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 376 the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) is provided for the Walnut Grove Correctional Facility. 377 378 SECTION 24. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, the amounts of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) is 379 380 provided for the Writing and Thinking Institute and Seventy-five 381 Thousand (\$75,000.00) is provided for the Very Special Arts 382 Program. SECTION 25. Of the funds appropriated herein, the State 383 Department of Education shall expend an amount not to exceed Three 384 385 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) for the purpose of

providing technical assistance and training to local school

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districts in the development of behavior modification plans and to 387 388 provide funding to defray the costs of psychological evaluations performed upon a child in compliance with the Mississippi School 389 390 Safety Act of 2001.
