Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, the amounts of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) is 379 380 provided for the Writing and Thinking Institute and Seventy-five 381 Thousand (\$75,000.00) is provided for the Very Special Arts 382 Program. 383 SECTION 25. Of the funds appropriated herein, the State Department of Education shall expend an amount not to exceed Three 384

Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) for the purpose of

providing technical assistance and training to local school

388	provide funding to defray the costs of psychological evaluations
