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General Funds.....\$ 5,963,330.00 28 Special Funds..... 29 13,489,898.00 30 Total.....\$ 19,453,228.00 31 Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation 32 Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase equal to fifty percent (50%) of the realignment component of the 33 Variable Compensation Plan or Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00), 34 whichever is greater, beginning on January 1, 2003. 35

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 36 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 37 38 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2004 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2003 39 40 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs, positions or pay increases are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi 41 Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget 42 Office, the State Personnel Board shall, on July 1, 2002, publish 43 separate annual projection reports, based on July 1, 2002, data, 44 45 for the period of July 1, 2002, through December 31, 2002, and January 1, 2003, through June 30, 2003, that project the annual 46 47 cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the 48 49 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases this projected cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2003 appropriation for 50 "Personal Services," as annualized on a semiannual basis in 51 52 accordance with the provisions of this act. If, at the end of any calendar month, the State Personnel Board determines that the 53 agency has taken action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed 54 this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2003 "Personal 55 Services" appropriated level, when annualized in compliance with 56 57 the provisions of this act, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement 58 59 will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 60

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61 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 62 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 67 Section 2, funds included therein which are derived from penalties 68 and/or other funds collected by the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit 69 shall be available for the purpose of providing the state match 70 71 for federal funds available for the support of the unit, or for other lawful purposes as deemed appropriate by the Attorney 72 73 General. Further, it is the intent of the Legislature that any penalties and/or other funds collected and/or expended shall be 74 75 accounted for separately as to source and/or application of such funds. 76

SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 77 78 Attorney General's Office charge legal fees to all agencies where such legal services are provided. The Attorney General's Office 79 80 may contract these fees on a contract rate or an hourly rate, whichever is more appropriate. Contracts with the Attorney 81 82 General's Office for legal services or reimbursement for hourly legal services shall not require the approval of the State 83 The Attorney General's Office is further 84 Personnel Board. 85 authorized to escalate the amount of any of its major objects of expenditure in an amount not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty 86 Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00) above any amounts herein 87 authorized, and to increase the number of authorized positions in 88 order to provide the required legal services for such state 89 agencies. 90

91 SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 92 Section 2, the amount of Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars 93 (\$750,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be

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94 made available for expenditure by the Prosecutors Training 95 Division.

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 96 97 Attorney General's Office shall have the authority to accept, 98 budget and expend any source funds not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00), that become available to the 99 office to carry out the provisions of those funds in a manner 100 consistent with the rules and regulations of the Department of 101 Finance and Administration. None of the funds authorized in this 102 section shall be used to increase the major object of expenditure 103 104 "Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits."

SECTION 8. No part of the money herein appropriated shall be 105 used, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of paying any 106 107 clerk, stenographer, assistant, deputy or other person who may be related by blood or marriage within the third degree, computed by 108 109 the rules of civil law, to the official employing or having the right of employment or selection thereof; and in the event of any 110 111 such payment, then the official or person approving and making or receiving such payment shall be jointly and severally liable to 112 return to the State of Mississippi and to pay into the State 113 Treasury three (3) times any such amount so paid or received; 114 115 however, when the relationship is by affinity and the person through whom the relationship was established is dead, this 116 117 provision shall not apply.

SECTION 9. None of the funds appropriated by this act shall be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the Office of the Attorney General that are authorized by the Mississippi Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules or regulations that implement state or federal law.

124 **SECTION 10.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 125 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 126 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized

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in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 127 intended mission of this agency. 169 A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets set 170 above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the 171 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget 172 Committee for Fiscal Year 2004.

SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 173 174 Attorney General's Office shall have the authority to accept, budget and expend any source funds not to exceed Two Million 175 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,500,000.00) that become 176 177 available to the office for Boys and Girls Clubs, Big Brothers Big Sisters of America and Communities in Schools and to carry out the 178 179 provisions of those funds in a manner consistent with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration. 180 The Attorney General's Office is further authorized to escalate an 181 amount not to exceed Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars 182 (\$2,500,000.00) for such purposes of this section. 183

SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2, One Million Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,200,000.00) shall be derived from the Budget Contingency Fund created in Section 27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972.

188 **SECTION 13.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 189 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 190 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 191 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

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Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2002.
