- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10
- 11 SECTION 1. As used in Sections 1 through 18 of this act, the
- following words shall have the meanings ascribed herein unless the 12
- context clearly requires otherwise: 13
- (a) "Accreted value" of any bond means, as of any date 14
- of computation, an amount equal to the sum of (i) the stated 15
- 16 initial value of such bond, plus (ii) the interest accrued thereon
- from the issue date to the date of computation at the rate, 17
- compounded semiannually, that is necessary to produce the 18
- approximate yield to maturity shown for bonds of the same 19
- maturity. 20
- "State" means the State of Mississippi. 21 (b)
- "Commission" means the State Bond Commission. 22
- SECTION 2. (1) (a) A special fund, to be designated as the 23
- 24 "2002 IHL and State Agencies Capital Improvements Fund," is
- created within the State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained 25
- by the State Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate 26
- and apart from the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts 27
- remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse 28
- into the State General Fund, and any interest earned or investment 29
- earnings on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into such fund. 30

SECTION 5. The principal of and interest on the bonds 394 395 authorized under Sections 1 through 18 of this act shall be 396 payable in the manner provided in this section. Such bonds shall bear such date or dates, be in such denomination or denominations, 397 bear interest at such rate or rates (not to exceed the limits set 398 forth in Section 75-17-101, Mississippi Code of 1972), be payable 399 400 at such place or places within or without the State of Mississippi, shall mature absolutely at such time or times not to 401 402 exceed twenty-five (25) years from date of issue, be redeemable before maturity at such time or times and upon such terms, with or 403 404 without premium, shall bear such registration privileges, and 405 shall be substantially in such form, all as shall be determined by resolution of the commission. 406

SECTION 6. The bonds authorized by Sections 1 through 18 of this act shall be signed by the chairman of the commission, or by his facsimile signature, and the official seal of the commission shall be affixed thereto, attested by the secretary of the commission. The interest coupons, if any, to be attached to such bonds may be executed by the facsimile signatures of such officers. Whenever any such bonds shall have been signed by the officials designated to sign the bonds who were in office at the time of such signing but who may have ceased to be such officers before the sale and delivery of such bonds, or who may not have been in office on the date such bonds may bear, the signatures of such officers upon such bonds and coupons shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes and have the same effect as if the person so officially signing such bonds had remained in office until their delivery to the purchaser, or had been in office on the date such bonds may bear. However, notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, such bonds may be issued as

provided in the Registered Bond Act of the State of Mississippi.

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provisions of Sections 1 through 18 of this act have all the 426 qualities and incidents of negotiable instruments under the 427 428 provisions of the Uniform Commercial Code, and in exercising the 429 powers granted by Sections 1 through 18 of this act, the commission shall not be required to and need not comply with the 430 provisions of the Uniform Commercial Code. 431 SECTION 8. The commission shall act as the issuing agent for 432 the bonds authorized under Sections 1 through 18 of this act, 433 prescribe the form of the bonds, advertise for and accept bids, 434 435 issue and sell the bonds so authorized to be sold, pay all fees and costs incurred in such issuance and sale, and do any and all 436 437 other things necessary and advisable in connection with the issuance and sale of such bonds. The commission is authorized and 438 empowered to pay the costs that are incident to the sale, issuance 439 440 and delivery of the bonds authorized under Sections 1 through 18 of this act from the proceeds derived from the sale of such bonds. 441 442 The commission shall sell such bonds on sealed bids at public 443 sale, and for such price as it may determine to be for the best 444 interest of the State of Mississippi, but no such sale shall be 445 made at a price less than par plus accrued interest to the date of 446 delivery of the bonds to the purchaser. All interest accruing on 447 such bonds so issued shall be payable semiannually or annually; however, the first interest payment may be for any period of not 448 449 more than one (1) year. Notice of the sale of any such bonds shall be published at 450 451 least one time, not less than ten (10) days before the date of sale, and shall be so published in one or more newspapers 452 published or having a general circulation in the City of Jackson, 453 454 Mississippi, and in one or more other newspapers or financial journals with a national circulation, to be selected by the 455 456 commission.

SECTION 7. All bonds and interest coupons issued under the

The commission, when issuing any bonds under the authority of
Sections 1 through 18 of this act, may provide that bonds, at the
option of the State of Mississippi, may be called in for payment
and redemption at the call price named therein and accrued
interest on such date or dates named therein.

SECTION 9. The bonds issued under the provisions of Sections

463 1 through 18 of this act are general obligations of the State of Mississippi, and for the payment thereof the full faith and credit 464 of the State of Mississippi is irrevocably pledged. 465 If the funds appropriated by the Legislature are insufficient to pay the 466 467 principal of and the interest on such bonds as they become due, 468 then the deficiency shall be paid by the State Treasurer from any 469 funds in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated. All such 470 bonds shall contain recitals on their faces substantially covering the provisions of this section. 471

SECTION 10. Upon the issuance and sale of bonds under the provisions of Sections 1 through 18 of this act, the commission shall transfer the proceeds of any such sale or sales to the special funds created in Sections 2 and 3 of this act in the amounts provided for in Section 4(2) of this act. The proceeds of such bonds shall be disbursed solely upon the order of the Department of Finance and Administration under such restrictions, if any, as may be contained in the resolution providing for the issuance of the bonds.

481 SECTION 11. The bonds authorized under Sections 1 through 18 of this act may be issued without any other proceedings or the 482 happening of any other conditions or things other than those 483 proceedings, conditions and things which are specified or required 484 485 by Sections 1 through 18 of this act. Any resolution providing 486 for the issuance of bonds under the provisions of Sections 1 through 18 of this act shall become effective immediately upon its 487 488 adoption by the commission, and any such resolution may be adopted

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489 at any regular or special meeting of the commission by a majority

490 of its members.

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SECTION 12. The bonds authorized under the authority of 491 492 Sections 1 through 18 of this act may be validated in the Chancery 493 Court of the First Judicial District of Hinds County, Mississippi, in the manner and with the force and effect provided by Chapter 494 13, Title 31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the validation of 495 county, municipal, school district and other bonds. The notice to 496 497 taxpayers required by such statutes shall be published in a newspaper published or having a general circulation in the City of 498 499 Jackson, Mississippi.

SECTION 13. Any holder of bonds issued under the provisions of Sections 1 through 18 of this act or of any of the interest coupons pertaining thereto may, either at law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceeding, protect and enforce any and all rights granted under Sections 1 through 18 of this act, or under such resolution, and may enforce and compel performance of all duties required by Sections 1 through 18 of this act to be performed, in order to provide for the payment of bonds and interest thereon.

509 SECTION 14. All bonds issued under the provisions of 510 Sections 1 through 18 of this act shall be legal investments for trustees and other fiduciaries, and for savings banks, trust 511 companies and insurance companies organized under the laws of the 512 513 State of Mississippi, and such bonds shall be legal securities which may be deposited with and shall be received by all public 514 officers and bodies of this state and all municipalities and 515 political subdivisions for the purpose of securing the deposit of 516 public funds. 517

SECTION 15. Bonds issued under the provisions of Sections 1 through 18 of this act and income therefrom shall be exempt from all taxation in the State of Mississippi. 521 **SECTION 16.** The proceeds of the bonds issued under Sections

12 1 through 18 of this act shall be used solely for the purposes

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Administration, and such funds shall be paid by the State 1078 1079 Treasurer upon warrants issued by such department, which warrants shall be issued upon requisitions signed by the Executive Director 1080 1081 of the Department of Finance and Administration or his designee. 1082 Section 9. (1) The commission, at one time, or from time to 1083 time, may declare by resolution the necessity for issuance of general obligation bonds of the State of Mississippi to provide 1084 1085 funds for all costs incurred or to be incurred for the purposes 1086 described in Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 of this act. the adoption of a resolution by the Department of Finance and 1087 1088 Administration, declaring the necessity for the issuance of any part or all of the general obligation bonds authorized by this 1089 section, the Department of Finance and Administration shall 1090 deliver a certified copy of its resolution or resolutions to the 1091 commission. Upon receipt of such resolution, the commission, in 1092 its discretion, may act as the issuing agent, prescribe the form 1093 of the bonds, advertise for and accept bids, issue and sell the 1094 1095 bonds so authorized to be sold and do any and all other things necessary and advisable in connection with the issuance and sale 1096 1097 of such bonds. The total amount of bonds issued under Sections 1 through 23 of this act shall not exceed One Hundred Twenty Million 1098 1099 Nine Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$120,970,000.00). No bonds 1100 shall be issued under Sections 1 through 23 of this act after July 1, 2004. 1101

1126	Section 10. The principal of and interest on the bonds
1127	authorized under Sections 1 through 23 of this act shall be
1128	payable in the manner provided in this section. Such bonds shall
1129	bear such date or dates, be in such denomination or denominations,
1130	bear interest at such rate or rates (not to exceed the limits set
1131	forth in Section 75-17-101, Mississippi Code of 1972), be payable
1132	at such place or places within or without the State of
1133	Mississippi, shall mature absolutely at such time or times not to
1134	exceed twenty-five (25) years from date of issue, be redeemable
1135	before maturity at such time or times and upon such terms, with or
1136	without premium, shall bear such registration privileges, and
1137	shall be substantially in such form, all as shall be determined by
1138	resolution of the commission.
1139	Section 11. The bonds authorized by Sections 1 through 23 of
1140	this act shall be signed by the chairman of the commission, or by
1141	his facsimile signature, and the official seal of the commission
1142	shall be affixed thereto, attested by the secretary of the
1143	commission. The interest coupons, if any, to be attached to such

bonds may be executed by the facsimile signatures of such 1144 1145 officers. Whenever any such bonds shall have been signed by the officials designated to sign the bonds who were in office at the 1146 1147 time of such signing but who may have ceased to be such officers 1148 before the sale and delivery of such bonds, or who may not have 1149 been in office on the date such bonds may bear, the signatures of such officers upon such bonds and coupons shall nevertheless be 1150 valid and sufficient for all purposes and have the same effect as 1151 if the person so officially signing such bonds had remained in 1152 office until their delivery to the purchaser, or had been in 1153 1154 office on the date such bonds may bear. However, notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, such bonds may be issued as 1155 1156 provided in the Registered Bond Act of the State of Mississippi. All bonds and interest coupons issued under the 1157 Section 12. provisions of Sections 1 through 23 of this act have all the 1158 qualities and incidents of negotiable instruments under the 1159 provisions of the Uniform Commercial Code, and in exercising the 1160 1161 powers granted by Sections 1 through 23 of this act, the commission shall not be required to and need not comply with the 1162 1163 provisions of the Uniform Commercial Code. Section 13. The commission shall act as the issuing agent 1164 1165 for the bonds authorized under Sections 1 through 23 of this act, prescribe the form of the bonds, advertise for and accept bids, 1166 issue and sell the bonds so authorized to be sold, pay all fees 1167 1168 and costs incurred in such issuance and sale, and do any and all other things necessary and advisable in connection with the 1169 issuance and sale of such bonds. The commission is authorized and 1170 empowered to pay the costs that are incident to the sale, issuance 1171 and delivery of the bonds authorized under Sections 1 through 23 1172 of this act from the proceeds derived from the sale of such bonds. 1173 The commission shall sell such bonds on sealed bids at public 1174 1175 sale, and for such price as it may determine to be for the best interest of the State of Mississippi, but no such sale shall be 1176

All interest accruing on 1179 such bonds so issued shall be payable semiannually or annually; 1180 however, the first interest payment may be for any period of not 1181 more than one (1) year. The bonds issued under the provisions of Sections 1 through 23 of this act are general obligations of the 1195 1196 State of Mississippi, and for the payment thereof the full faith and credit of the State of Mississippi is irrevocably pledged. 1197 1198 the funds appropriated by the Legislature are insufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on such bonds as they become 1199 due, then the deficiency shall be paid by the State Treasurer from 1200 1201 any funds in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated. such bonds shall contain recitals on their faces substantially 1202 1203 covering the provisions of this section. Upon the issuance and sale of bonds under the 1204 Section 15. provisions of Sections 1 through 23 of this act, the commission 1205 shall transfer the proceeds of any such sale or sales to the 1206 special funds created in Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 of this 1207 1208 act in the amount provided for in Section 9(2) of this act.

Any resolution providing 1217 for the issuance of bonds under the provisions of Sections 1 1218 through 23 of this act shall become effective immediately upon its 1219 1220 adoption by the commission, and any such resolution may be adopted at any regular or special meeting of the commission by a majority 1221 1222 of its members. Section 17. The bonds authorized under the authority of 1223 Sections 1 through 23 of this act may be validated in the Chancery 1224 Court of the First Judicial District of Hinds County, Mississippi, 1225 1226 in the manner and with the force and effect provided by Chapter 1227 13, Title 31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the validation of county, municipal, school district and other bonds. 1228 The notice to 1229 taxpayers required by such statutes shall be published in a newspaper published or having a general circulation in the City of 1230 1231 Jackson, Mississippi. Any holder of bonds issued under the provisions Section 18. 1232 of Sections 1 through 23 of this act or of any of the interest 1233 1234 coupons pertaining thereto may, either at law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceeding, protect and enforce 1235 1236 any and all rights granted under Sections 1 through 23 of this act, or under such resolution, and may enforce and compel 1237 performance of all duties required by Sections 1 through 23 of 1238

this act to be performed, in order to provide for the payment of

Section 19. All bonds issued under the provisions of

1243	trustees and other fiduciaries, and for savings banks, trust
1244	companies and insurance companies organized under the laws of the
1245	State of Mississippi, and such bonds shall be legal securities
1246	which may be deposited with and shall be received by all public
1247	officers and bodies of this state and all municipalities and
1248	political subdivisions for the purpose of securing the deposit of

Section 20. Bonds issued under the provisions of Sections 1 1251 through 23 of this act and income therefrom shall be exempt from 1252 all taxation in the State of Mississippi.

Section 21. The proceeds of the bonds issued under Sections 1254 1 through 23 of this act shall be used solely for the purposes 1255 herein provided, including the costs incident to the issuance and 1256 sale of such bonds.

1257 Section 22. The State Treasurer is authorized, without further process of law, to certify to the Department of Finance 1258 1259 and Administration the necessity for warrants, and the Department 1260 of Finance and Administration is authorized and directed to issue such warrants, in such amounts as may be necessary to pay when due 1261 1262 the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on, or the accreted value of, all bonds issued under Sections 1 through 23 of 1263 1264 this act; and the State Treasurer shall forward the necessary amount to the designated place or places of payment of such bonds 1265 in ample time to discharge such bonds, or the interest thereon, on 1266 1267 the due dates thereof.

Section 23. Sections 1 through 23 of this act shall be
deemed to be full and complete authority for the exercise of the
powers herein granted, but Sections 1 through 23 of this act shall
not be deemed to repeal or to be in derogation of any existing law
of this state.

1273 **SECTION 20**. This act shall take effect and be in force from 1274 and after its passage.
