- 8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF
- MISSISSIPPI, That the following amendment to the Mississippi 9
- Constitution of 1890 is proposed to the qualified electors of the 10
- state: 11
- Amend Section 170, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read 12
- as follows: 13
- "Section 170. Each county shall be divided into five 14
- 15 districts, a resident freeholder of each district shall be
- selected, in the manner prescribed by law, and the five so chosen 16
- shall constitute the board of supervisors of the county, a 17
- majority of whom may transact business. Each member of the board 18
- of supervisors elected to a term of office beginning on or after 19
- 20 January 1, 2004, must be a high school graduate or have a general
- equivalency diploma unless he or she served as a member of a board 21
- of supervisors before January 1, 2004. The board of supervisors 22
- 23 shall have full jurisdiction over roads, ferries, and bridges, to
- be exercised in accordance with such regulations as the 24
- Legislature may prescribe, and perform such other duties as may be 25
- required by law; provided, however, that the Legislature may have 26
- the power to designate certain highways as "state highways," and 27
- 28 place such highways under the control and supervision of the State

- 30 of the chancery court shall be the clerk of the board of
- 31 supervisors."
- 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be
- 33 submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at
- 34 an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday
- of November 2002, as provided by Section 273 of the Constitution
- 36 and by general law.
- 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed
- 38 amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed
- 39 constitutional amendment requires that each member of a county
- 40 board of supervisors elected to a term of office beginning on or
- 41 after January 1, 2004, must be a high school graduate or have a
- 42 general equivalency diploma (GED) unless he or she served as a
- 43 member of a board of supervisors before January 1, 2004."
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Attorney General of the
- 45 State of Mississippi shall submit this resolution, immediately
- 46 upon adoption by the Legislature to the Attorney General of the
- 47 United States or to the United States District Court for the
- 48 District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the
- 49 Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
