HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 86

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE SERVICE OF ALPHA KAPPA 1 ALPHA SORORITY AND CONGRATULATING IT ON THE OCCASION OF ALPHA 2 3 KAPPA ALPHA DAY AT THE STATE CAPITOL. WHEREAS, in a period of 50 years, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, 4 5 Inc., (AKA) founded at Howard University in Washington, D.C., in 1908, grew from one undergraduate group of nine members to a 6 national organization with an active membership of more than 7 8 10,000; and WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority presently boasts a 9 membership of more than 100,000 college-educated women and is now 10 recognized as an international organization involved in world and 11 12 community affairs; and 13 WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority provides grants, scholarships and fellowships in its efforts to support students 14 15 nationwide; and WHEREAS, Dr. Norma Solomon White, the international 16 president, has six target areas, to wit: Education (The Ivy 17 18 Akademy and the On-Track Mentoring Program); Health (the Child Health Insurance Program, and the Buckle Up Program); The Black 19 Family (AKA Coat Day); Economics (the Black Dollar Day Campaigns); 20 21 The Arts (preserving African-American Music); and Leadership Development (leadership workshops and the Leadership Fellows 22 23 Program); and WHEREAS, for many years Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., has 24

24 WHEREAS, for many years Alpha Kappa Alpha Sofority, file., has 25 been involved in public policy issues that impact the lives of 26 great numbers of African Americans; and 27 WHEREAS, a public policy standing committee known as the 28 Connection Committee was created and is composed of a chairman and 29 a representative from each of the ten regions appointed by the 30 international president; and

31 WHEREAS, the purpose of the Connection Committee includes (1) 32 identifying and studying local, state and national issues which 33 impact upon the quality of life for all mankind, and (2) designing 34 strategies for communications with the membership regarding 35 advocacy issues; and

36 WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha members throughout the State of 37 Mississippi will convene at the State Capitol March 12, 2002, to 38 advocate issues that impact the lives of people in their 39 respective communities; and

WHEREAS, emphasis for the 2002 AKA Day at the State Capitol will be (1) a dialogue regarding reapportionment, redistricting and the probable impact on the African-American community, and (2) a discussion/information period to determine the types of voting machines in our state, the problems, if any, with accuracy, the number of discarded votes and proposed reforms to improve the voting system before the next general election; and

WHEREAS, as a result, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, proclaimed March 12, 2002, as Alpha Kappa Alpha Day at the State Capitol; and
