## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 95

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE 2 STATE BOARD FOR COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES' LONGTIME EXECUTIVE 3 DIRECTOR, DR. OLON RAY, ON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT AFTER 40 4 YEARS OF DEDICATED PUBLIC SERVICE IN PUBLIC EDUCATION.

5 WHEREAS, Dr. Olon E. Ray announced plans of retirement from 6 his position as Executive Director of the State Board for 7 Community and Junior Colleges; and

8 WHEREAS, since October 1, 1990, Dr. Ray has been Executive 9 Director of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, 10 working with a ten-member board in the coordination of the state's 11 15 public community and junior colleges, overseeing and executing 12 the policies of the board and other programs specified by statutes 13 of Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, under his leadership the board has experienced an unprecedented growth in the numbers of students served, from 48,306 to 53,669, and an increase in its budget from approximately \$72 million to \$187 million; and

18 WHEREAS, after receiving his bachelor's degree in 1962, from 19 the University of Mississippi, Dr. Ray began his professional work 20 in education as a history teacher at Biloxi High School, remaining 21 until 1964, when he left in order to teach at Jackson Central High 22 School for one year before returning to Biloxi to begin 23 administrative work as Assistant to the Superintendent; and

WHEREAS, named Assistant Superintendent of the Biloxi Public
School District in 1970, Dr. Ray became Superintendent of the
district in 1975, serving 13 years before resigning in 1988, to
accept the position of Special Assistant for Education in the
Governor's Office, under the administration of Governor Ray Mabus,

29 where he remained for two years before accepting his present 30 position; and

31 WHEREAS, while Superintendent of the Biloxi schools, Dr. Ray 32 was appointed by Governor William Winter to serve as Chairman of 33 the Performance-Based School Accreditation Task Force of 34 Mississippi, created by the State Legislature under the Education 35 Act of 1982, implementing for the first time in the history of 36 American education, school accreditation tied to educational 37 performance of students in certain critical areas; and

38 WHEREAS, as Special Assistant for Education to Governor Ray 39 Mabus, Dr. Ray attended, as the Assistant to the Governor, 40 President George Bush's 1989 Summit on Education, in 41 Charlottesville, Virginia, participated and contributed to the 42 National Governors Association Advisory Committee on National 43 Goals in 1989 and 1990, and helped develop, prepare and pass the 44 legislation known by the title "Mississippi's BEST"; and

45 WHEREAS, Dr. Ray's selected civil and professional awards and honors include: Outstanding Educational Administrator of 46 Mississippi, 1976; Mississippi Man of the Year Award, 1989; 47 48 Harrison County United Way Leadership Award, 1971; Outstanding Young Man of Biloxi, 1972; Boss of the Year, 1982; Chairman, 49 Biloxi Bicentennial Commission, 1976; President, Harrison County 50 United Way, 1983; District Governor, Lions International; 51 appointed member of the State of Mississippi Parole Board, 1977; 52 53 Mississippi Community Education Award, 1982; Chairman, Education Committee, Mississippi Economic Council, 1982; Ed Ransdell Media 54 55 Award, 1984; Outstanding Alumni for Louisiana, Mississippi District, January 1996; Phi Theta Kappa Board for Directors Alumni 56 Award, April 1995; and MAACE Friend of Education Award, June 1995; 57 58 and

59 WHEREAS, a native Mississippian, Dr. Ray received his formal 60 education in the public school system, graduated from Weir High 61 School, and attended Northwest Mississippi Community College

64 WHEREAS, Dr. Ray is married to the former Ann Traylor, of 65 Sumrall, Mississippi, who has remained faithful in the support of 66 his every endeavor; and

67 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to acknowledge 68 greatness in such outstanding Mississippians as Dr. Ray, whose 69 legacy of service and longtime oversight in the field of public 70 education and in state government has been greatly appreciated by 71 the citizens of this state:
