HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 106

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING MR. AND
2 MRS. PAUL L. PARKER ON RECEIVING THE 2001-2002 JUNIOR AUXILIARY OF
3 WATER VALLEY COMMUNITY INSPIRATION AWARD.

4 WHEREAS, Mr. and Mrs. Paul L. Parker, residents of Water
5 Valley, Mississippi, were recently chosen by the Junior Auxiliary
6 of Water Valley as recipients of the 2001-2002 Community
7 Inspiration Award; and

8 WHEREAS, born July 29, 1915, Mr. Parker graduated from Macon
9 High School in Noxubee County, Mississippi, and moved to Water
10 Valley, where he opened his first business in 1937; and

11 WHEREAS, Mrs. Charlotte Fredonia Todd Parker, born September
12 11, 1915, and raised in Oxford, Mississippi, was a school teacher
13 at Camp Ground School; and

14 WHEREAS, May 7, 1939, Mr. and Mrs. Parker were united in
15 holy matrimony, and to their union, one daughter, the late
16 Charlotte Nancy Parker Turnipseed was born; and

17 WHEREAS, Mr. Parker, a World War II veteran, who valiantly
18 served the United States from October 17, 1943, to January 9,
19 1946, has quite a notable reputation in and around the Water
20 Valley community; and

21 WHEREAS, loyally serving as Water Valley's postmaster for
22 nearly 30 years, Mr. Parker, once called "The Political Chief of
23 Yalobusha County" by Senator Jim Eastland, was elected Alderman at
24 Large and served as tri-county campaign manager for Senator John
25 C. Stennis and as Colonel on Governor Fielding L. Wright's staff;

27 WHEREAS, Mrs. Parker, devoted to loving her husband and
28 attending the needs of her family, operated the family business
29 while her husband bravely fought on our nation's behalf in World
30 War II; and

31 WHEREAS, sharing an endless amount of love for one another,
32 Mr. and Mrs. Parker have also shared many honors in addition to
33 the 2001-2002 Community Inspiration Award, including their
34 selection as Water Valley Ambassadors; the 1996 Grand Marshals for
35 the Christmas Parade; and the 2002 Young at Heart Valentine
36 Sweetheart Couple by the First Baptist Church of Water Valley; and

37 WHEREAS, being righteously committed to their Christian
38 service as members of the First Baptist Church of Water Valley,
39 Mr. and Mrs. Parker remain devoted in their faith, with Mr. Parker
40 serving as Deacon and Mrs. Parker serving as Sunday School Teacher
41 and as a member of the Flower and Memorial Committees; and

42 WHEREAS, Mr. Parker, a member of the Independent Order of Odd
43 Fellows and Board of Directors for the Bank of Water Valley,
44 received the Rotary Paul Harris Award; and

45 WHEREAS, the life and times of Mr. Parker are chronicled for
46 all to enjoy for generations to come in his autobiography, "It Was
47 Worth it All"; and

48 WHEREAS, Mrs. Parker, a fervent supporter of the WMU Mission
49 Support, is a charter member of both the Junior Auxiliary of Water
50 Valley and the Water Valley Garden Club; and

51 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize
52 and commend Mississippians such as Mr. and Mrs. Paul L. Parker,
53 whose many noteworthy accomplishments and contributions to the
54 Water Valley community epitomize a life of community service which
55 serves as a model for all:

56 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
57 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
58 THEREIN, That we do hereby commend and congratulate Mr. and Mrs.
59 Paul Lincoln Parker of Water Valley, Mississippi, on being

61 Award and extend to them our heartiest wishes for many more years
