- 20 and has been featured with such artists as Steve Coleman and Five
- 21 Elements, the M-Base Collective, New Air and Bob Belden's
- 22 Manhattan Rhythm Club; and
- 23 WHEREAS, having toured extensively throughout the United
- 24 States and abroad, Ms. Wilson has been featured in many national
- 25 magazines including "New York Magazine," "Rollingstone," "USA
