SENATE BILL NO. 2035

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-3-53, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 DIRECT THE STATE BOARD TO USE CERTAIN CATEGORIES FOR DESIGNATING 2 THE PERFORMANCE OF SCHOOLS AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS UNDER THE 3 "MISSISSIPPI REPORT CARD"; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 37-3-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 amended as follows: 7

8 37-3-53. Each school year, the State Board of Education, 9 acting through the Office of Educational Accountability, shall develop a public school reporting system, or "Mississippi Report 10 Card," on the performance of students and schools at the local, 11 district and state level. The Mississippi Report Card shall use 12 the following categories for designating the performance of 13 schools and school districts: Exemplary, Recognized, Acceptable, 14 Below Average and Low-Performing. In developing the report card, 15 the Office of Educational Accountability shall collect school, 16 17 district and state level student achievement data in the appropriate grades as designated by the State Board of Education 18 in all core subjects, and compare the data with national standards 19 to identify students' strengths and weaknesses. The Mississippi 20 Report Card shall provide more than reports to parents on the 21 level at which their children are performing; the report shall 22 provide clear and comparable public information on the level at 23 which schools, school districts and the state public education 24 system are performing. The Office of Educational Accountability 25 26 shall encourage local school districts and the general public to use Mississippi Report Card information along with local 27 individual student data to assess the quality of instructional 28 S. 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29 programs and the performance of schools and to plan and implement 30 programs of instructional improvement.

Beginning with the 1998-1999 school year, the Mississippi Report Card shall include information, as compiled by the Office of Compulsory School Attendance Enforcement, which demonstrates clearly the absenteeism and dropout rates in each school district and the state and whether those rates reflect a positive or negative change from the same information as reported in the previous year's Mississippi Report Card.

38 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 39 and after July 1, 2002.
