COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2058

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 65-3-97, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE DESCRIPTION OF A SEGMENT IN PHASE 4 OF THE 1987 3 FOUR-LANE HIGHWAY PROGRAM; TO AUTHORIZE ADDITIONAL FEDERAL FUNDS TO BE USED FOR THE 1987 FOUR-LANE HIGHWAY PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE THAT SUCH FEDERAL FUNDS MAY BE UTILIZED IN LIEU OF STATE FUNDING THAT WOULD OTHERWISE BE UTILIZED FOR SUCH PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE THAT THE 6 7 ANNUAL TOTAL AMOUNT OF FUNDING FOR THE 1987 FOUR-LANE HIGHWAY PROGRAM SHALL NOT BE LESS THAN IT WOULD HAVE OTHERWISE BEEN 8 WITHOUT THE UTILIZATION OF SUCH ADDITIONAL FEDERAL FUNDS; TO 9 10 REVISE THE DESCRIPTION OF A ROUTE IN PHASE 4 OF THE PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 11

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 65-3-97, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 14 amended as follows:
- 15 65-3-97. (1) In addition to and including all other
- 16 highways designated as a part of the state highway system, there
- 17 is hereby designated as a part thereof a four-lane highway system
- 18 to connect various areas of the state with interstate and primary
- 19 highways. The Mississippi Department of Transportation shall
- 20 construct and reconstruct four-lane highways, that is, not less
- 21 than two (2) lanes for traffic flowing in each direction, along
- 22 the routes designated in this section.
- 23 (2) In the construction and reconstruction of the four-lane
- 24 highway system designated in this section, the Mississippi
- 25 Department of Transportation may utilize the roadway of any
- 26 existing highway under its jurisdiction and control and shall do
- 27 so when such utilization is feasible, provided that such highways
- 28 which are utilized shall be constructed to current standards for
- 29 such roadways. When it is not feasible to utilize existing
- 30 designated highways, the Transportation Department shall relocate

- 31 such highways and construct entirely new facilities whether in
- 32 urban or rural areas.
- 33 (3) Construction of the four-lane highway system designated
- 34 in this subsection shall commence, proceed and be performed by the
- 35 Mississippi Department of Transportation strictly in accordance
- 36 with the following set of priorities established for the letting
- 37 of contracts on and along various segments thereof:
- 38 (a) Of the following group of highway segments not less
- 39 than fifteen percent (15%) of all contracts necessary to be let
- 40 for completion of all segments within the group shall be let by
- 41 June 30, 1988, not less than thirty percent (30%) of such
- 42 contracts shall be let by June 30, 1989, not less than fifty
- 43 percent (50%) of such contracts shall be let by June 30, 1990, not
- 44 less than seventy percent (70%) of such contracts shall be let by
- 45 June 30, 1991, not less than ninety percent (90%) of such
- 46 contracts shall be let by June 30, 1992, and one hundred percent
- 47 (100%) of such contracts shall be let by June 30, 1993:
- 48 (i) Highway segments along or near U.S. 45
- 49 beginning at the Clarke/Lauderdale county line and extending
- 50 northerly to I-59; then beginning at Macon and extending northerly
- 51 to Brooksville; then beginning at Columbus Air Force Base and
- 52 extending northerly to Aberdeen; then beginning at U.S. 278 and
- 53 extending northerly to Shannon; then beginning at Saltillo and
- 54 extending northerly to Corinth.
- (ii) Highway segments along or near U.S. 45A
- 56 beginning at U.S. 82 and extending northerly to West Point; then
- 57 beginning four (4) miles south of Okolona and extending northerly
- 58 to Shannon.
- 59 (iii) A highway segment along or near U.S. 49W
- 60 beginning at U.S. 49 and extending westerly through Yazoo City to
- 61 the Yazoo River.
- 62 (iv) A highway segment along or near U.S. 49W
- 63 beginning at Inverness and extending northerly to Indianola.

- (v) A highway segment along or near U.S. 61
- 65 beginning at Port Gibson and extending northerly to the four-lane
- 66 south of Vicksburg.
- (vi) Highway segments along or near U.S. 72
- 68 beginning at or near Mt. Pleasant and extending southeasterly to
- 69 Mississippi 5; then beginning at Walnut and extending
- 70 southeasterly to Corinth; then beginning at Strickland and
- 71 extending southeasterly to Burnsville.
- 72 (vii) Highway segments along or near U.S. 78
- 73 beginning at Holly Springs and extending southeasterly to the New
- 74 Albany bypass; then beginning at Mississippi 25 and extending
- 75 southeasterly to Tremont.
- 76 (viii) Highway segments along or near U.S. 82
- 77 beginning at I-55 and extending easterly to Kilmichael; then
- 78 beginning at Eupora and extending easterly to Mathiston; then
- 79 beginning at Mississippi 12 and extending easterly to the Alabama
- 80 state line.
- 81 (ix) A highway segment along or near U.S. 84
- 82 beginning at I-59 and extending easterly to the Jones/Wayne county
- 83 line.
- 84 (x) Highway segments along or near U.S. 98
- 85 beginning at Columbia and extending easterly to the Marion/Lamar
- 86 county line; then beginning at U.S. 49 and extending southeasterly
- 87 to the Alabama state line.
- 88 (b) Of the following group of highway segments not less
- 89 than five percent (5%) of all contracts necessary to be let for
- 90 completion of all segments within the group shall be let by June
- 91 30, 1991, not less than ten percent (10%) of such contracts shall
- 92 be let by June 30, 1992, not less than twenty-five percent (25%)
- 93 of such contracts shall be let by June 30, 1993, not less than
- 94 forty percent (40%) of such contracts shall be let by June 30,
- 95 1994, not less than fifty-five percent (55%) of such contracts

96 shall be let by June 30, 1995, not less than seventy percent (70%)

- 97 of such contracts shall be let by June 30, 1996, not less than
- 98 eighty-five percent (85%) of such contracts shall be let by June
- 99 30, 1997, and one hundred percent (100%) of such contracts shall
- 100 be let by June 30, 1998:
- 101 (i) Highway segments along or near Mississippi 25
- 102 beginning at Mississippi 471 and extending northeasterly to
- 103 Mississippi 43; then beginning at the Winston/Oktibbeha county
- 104 line and extending northeasterly to Starkville.
- 105 (ii) A highway segment along or near Mississippi
- 106 63 beginning at the Jackson/George county line and extending
- 107 northerly to Lucedale.
- 108 (iii) A highway segment along or near Mississippi
- 109 302 beginning at I-55 in Southaven and extending easterly to U.S.
- 110 72 at or near Mt. Pleasant.
- 111 (iv) Highway segments along or near U.S. 45
- 112 beginning at the Alabama state line and extending northerly to the
- 113 Clarke/Lauderdale county line; then beginning at Lauderdale and
- 114 extending northerly to Macon; then beginning at Aberdeen and
- 115 extending northerly to U.S. 278.
- 116 (v) A highway segment along or near U.S. 45A
- 117 beginning at West Point and extending northerly to four (4) miles
- 118 south of Okolona.
- (vi) A highway segment beginning at Brooksville
- 120 along or near U.S. 45 or U.S. 45A and extending northerly to U.S.
- 121 82, such segment having been designated by the Transportation
- 122 Commission pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (1)(c) of this
- 123 section.
- 124 (vii) A highway segment along or near U.S. 49W
- 125 beginning at the Yazoo River and extending northerly to Inverness.
- 126 (viii) Highway segments along or near U.S. 61
- 127 beginning at the Louisiana state line and extending northerly to
- 128 the Wilkinson/Adams county line; then beginning at Washington and
- 129 extending northerly to Port Gibson; then beginning at Merigold and

- 130 extending northerly to Shelby; then beginning at the north end of
- 131 the Clarksdale bypass and extending northerly to the Tennessee
- 132 state line.
- 133 (ix) A highway segment along or near U.S. 72
- 134 beginning at Mississippi 5 and extending southeasterly to Walnut.
- 135 (x) A highway segment along or near U.S. 78
- 136 beginning at Tremont and extending southeasterly to the Alabama
- 137 state line.
- 138 (xi) Highway segments along or near U.S. 82
- 139 beginning at the Montgomery/Webster county line and extending
- 140 easterly to Eupora; then beginning at Mathiston and extending
- 141 easterly to Starkville.
- 142 (xii) Highway segments along or near U.S. 84
- 143 beginning at Leesdale and extending easterly to Roxie; then
- 144 beginning at Auburn Road and extending easterly to I-55; then
- 145 beginning at the east end of the Brookhaven bypass and extending
- 146 easterly to Prentiss; then beginning at the Jones/Covington county
- 147 line and extending easterly to Horse Creek; then beginning at the
- 148 Jones/Wayne county line and extending easterly to Waynesboro.
- 149 (xiii) Highway segments along or near U.S. 98
- 150 beginning at the Pike/Walthall county line and extending easterly
- 151 to Columbia; then beginning at the Marion/Lamar county line and
- 152 extending easterly to the four-lane west of Hattiesburg.
- (c) Of the following group of highway segments not less
- 154 than ten percent (10%) of all contracts necessary to be let for
- 155 completion of all segments within the group shall be let by June
- 156 30, 1996, not less than twenty percent (20%) of such contracts
- 157 shall be let by June 30, 1997, not less than forty percent (40%)
- of such contracts shall be let by June 30, 1998, and one hundred
- 159 percent (100%) of such contracts shall be let by June 30, 1999:
- 160 (i) A highway segment along or near Mississippi 25
- 161 beginning at Mississippi 43 and extending northeasterly to the
- 162 Winston/Oktibbeha county line.

- 163 (ii) A highway segment along or near Mississippi
- 164 63 beginning at Lucedale and extending northerly to U.S. 45 at
- 165 State Line.
- 166 (iii) A highway segment along or near U.S. 61
- 167 beginning at Shelby and extending northerly to U.S. 49.
- 168 (iv) A highway segment along or near U.S. 82
- 169 beginning at Kilmichael and extending easterly to the
- 170 Montgomery/Webster county line.
- 171 (v) Highway segments along or near U.S. 84
- 172 beginning at Eddiceton and extending easterly to Auburn Road; then
- 173 beginning at Prentiss and extending easterly to Collins; then
- 174 beginning at Waynesboro and extending easterly to the Alabama
- 175 state line.
- (d) (i) Of the following group of highway segments not
- 177 less than five percent (5%) of all contracts necessary to be let
- 178 for completion of all segments within the group shall be let by
- June 30, 2002, not less than fifteen percent (15%) of such
- 180 contracts shall be let by June 30, 2003, not less than twenty-five
- 181 percent (25%) of such contracts shall be let by June 30, 2004, not
- 182 less than thirty-five percent (35%) of such contracts shall be let
- 183 by June 30, 2005, not less than forty-five percent (45%) of such
- 184 contracts shall be let by June 30, 2006, not less than sixty
- 185 percent (60%) of such contracts shall be let by June 30, 2007, not
- less than seventy percent (70%) of such contracts shall be let by
- 187 June 30, 2008, not less than eighty percent (80%) of such
- 188 contracts shall be let by June 30, 2009, not less than ninety
- 189 percent (90%) of such contracts shall be let by June 30, 2010, and
- 190 one hundred percent (100%) of such contracts shall be let by June
- 191 30, 2011:
- 192 A. A highway segment along or near
- 193 Mississippi 6 beginning at the Clarksdale bypass and extending
- 194 easterly to Batesville.

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- 196 Mississippi 12 beginning at I-55 and extending easterly to
- 197 Kosciusko.
- 198 C. A highway segment along or near
- 199 Mississippi 15 beginning at I-10 and extending northerly to * * *

- D. A highway segment consisting of two (2)
- 202 lanes of construction and two (2) lanes of right-of-way
- 203 acquisition along or near Mississippi 15 beginning at Mississippi
- 204 26 and extending northerly to U.S. Highway 98.
- 205 E. A highway segment along or near
- 206 Mississippi 19 beginning at Collinsville and extending
- 207 northwesterly to Kosciusko.
- F. Highway segments along or near Mississippi
- 209 25 beginning at Aberdeen and extending northerly to Fulton; then
- 210 beginning at the Alabama state line and extending northerly to
- 211 U.S. Highway 72.
- G. A highway segment along or near U.S.
- 213 Highway 61 beginning at Redwood and extending northerly to Leland.
- 214 H. A highway segment along or near U.S.
- 215 Highway 98 beginning at Meadville and extending southeasterly to
- 216 Summit.
- I. A highway segment along or near
- 218 Mississippi Highway 24 * * * beginning at Woodville and extending
- 219 easterly to McComb.
- J. A highway segment along or near
- 221 Mississippi 35 beginning at the Mississippi/Louisiana state line
- 222 and extending northerly to or near Foxworth.
- 223 K. A highway segment along or near
- 224 Mississippi 27 beginning at I-20 and extending southeasterly to
- 225 I-55.

L. A highway segment along or near 226 Mississippi 57 beginning at I-10 and extending northerly ten (10) 227 miles to just north of the community of Van Cleave. 228 229 (ii) Contracts for the construction and/or 230 reconstruction of highway segments designated within this group shall be let by the Transportation Commission strictly in 231 accordance with the volume capacity of the highway segment. 232 the volume capacity of a highway segment is less than the volume 233 234 capacity threshold at which the Transportation Department recommends the construction of a four-lane highway, then the 235 236 Transportation Department shall make other improvements and highway modifications to such highway segment as needed, such as 237 238 straightening and realignment of the existing roadway, the addition of passing lanes and the widening of existing lanes, and 239 may acquire any necessary right-of-way for such purposes and for 240 241 the purpose of future construction of four-lane highways along 242 such segments. The construction priorities established in this section 243

- shall not be construed as prohibiting the completion of highway segments which, on July 1, 1987, are included in the current three-year plan under Section 65-1-141, and for which, on July 1, 1987, grade and drainage has been completed or contracts for grade and drainage have been let.
- Contracts may be let and construction may commence and 249 250 be performed concurrently on any of the highway segments designated in subsection (3) of this section, notwithstanding the 251 priorities established for the letting of contracts on the various 252 253 segments designated therein, provided that funds are available 254 and, provided that, at all times, the percentages of all contracts 255 required to be let on the segments designated in paragraphs (3)(a), (3)(b), (3)(c) and (3)(d), respectively, are, in fact, let 256
- 257 no later than the dates established therein.

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(6) (a) All highway construction and reconstruction
authorized under this section shall be performed by contract let
on competitive bid in the manner provided by statute; however,
highway segments shall be constructed in lengths of not less than
ten (10) miles.

It is the intent of the Legislature that not less

- 264 than ten percent (10%) of the amounts authorized to be expended for construction and reconstruction of the four-lane highway 265 segments designated in this section shall be expended with small 266 267 business concerns owned and controlled by socially and 268 economically disadvantaged individuals. The term "socially and 269 economically disadvantaged individuals" shall have the meaning ascribed to such term under Section 8(d) of the Small Business Act 270 (15 USCS, Section 637(d)) and relevant subcontracting regulations 271 promulgated pursuant thereto; except that women shall be presumed 272 to be socially and economically disadvantaged individuals for the 273 purposes of this paragraph (b). 274
- (7) (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (6)(a)
 of this section, the Mississippi Transportation Commission may
 construct highway segments of less than ten (10) miles in length
 if:
- 279 (i) The segment as described in subsection (3) of 280 this section is less than ten (10) miles in length;
- 281 (ii) The segment will connect two (2) existing 282 four-lane highways;
- 283 (iii) The segment will connect an existing 284 four-lane highway with an incorporated municipality;
- (iv) The segment will connect an existing
 four-lane highway with a river, the state boundary or any other
 natural or man-made barrier;
- (v) For a particular project, the costs of constructing a single segment of at least ten (10) miles in length

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- 290 would greatly exceed the aggregate costs of constructing two (2)
- 291 or more segments; or
- 292 (vi) The segment is in an urban area and involves
- 293 the completion of bypasses or other construction which will
- 294 facilitate and accommodate major traffic movement.
- 295 (b) In any case in which the Transportation Commission
- 296 authorizes the construction of a highway segment of less than ten
- 297 (10) miles in length, the commission shall set forth and record in
- 298 its official minutes explanation and justification therefor based
- 299 upon one or more of the conditions prescribed in paragraph (7)(a)
- 300 of this section.
- 301 (8) (a) To assist in defraying the costs and expenses for
- 302 construction, reconstruction and relocation of the four-lane
- 303 highway system described in this section, the following revenues
- 304 shall be paid out of such funds made available to the
- 305 Transportation Commission and the Transportation Department:
- 306 (i) From matched federal funds or other federal
- 307 funds, Thirty-two Million Dollars (\$32,000,000.00) for fiscal year
- 308 1988, Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$25,000,000.00) for fiscal year
- 309 1989, Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00) for fiscal year 1990
- and fifty percent (50%) of such federal funds for fiscal year 1991
- 311 and each fiscal year thereafter; and
- 312 <u>(ii)</u> Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) from
- 313 matched federal bridge replacement funds for fiscal year 1988 and
- 314 each fiscal year thereafter when the segments proposed for
- 315 construction contain bridges that are eligible for replacement
- 316 under the Federal Aid Bridge Replacement Program.
- 317 (b) Federal funds in addition to the federal funds
- 318 specified in paragraph (a) of this subsection (8) may be used for
- 319 the construction, reconstruction and relocation of the four-lane
- 320 highway system described in this section. Such federal funds may
- 321 be utilized in lieu of state funding that would otherwise be
- 322 <u>utilized for such system; provided, however, that the annual total</u>

323	amount	of	funding	for	the	construction.	reconstruction	and
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- 324 relocation of the four-lane highway system described in this
- 325 section shall not be less than it would have otherwise been
- 326 without the utilization of such additional federal funds.
- 327 (9) The Transportation Department shall submit a report to
- 328 the Legislature by January 10 of each calendar year setting forth
- 329 the current status of the construction program set forth in this
- 330 section to include, but not be limited to, the following
- 331 information:
- 332 (a) Specific segments on which engineering is being
- 333 performed or has been completed;
- 334 (b) Specific segments for which right-of-way has been
- 335 acquired or is being acquired;
- 336 (c) Specific segments for which construction contracts
- 337 have been let;
- 338 (d) Specific segments on which construction is in
- 339 progress;
- 340 (e) Specific segments on which construction has been
- 341 completed;
- 342 (f) Projections for completion of the next step on each
- 343 segment;
- 344 (g) Revenue derived for such construction program from
- each revenue source contained in Chapter 322, Laws, 1987, and in
- 346 Chapter 557, Laws, 1994;
- (h) For each fiscal year beginning in 1994, a detailed
- 348 cash flow projection by source of program activities and an
- 349 estimate of when the program will encounter a funding shortage due
- 350 to costs exceeding original projections;
- 351 (i) A schedule of all complete and open-to-traffic
- 352 highway segments and the related total cost of each segment;

- 353 (j) A schedule of all highway segments on which all
- 354 contracts necessary for completion of the segments were not let as
- 355 of the date required by law;

356	(k) A complete recap of all program receipts by source,
357	and of all disbursements for the prior fiscal year and cumulative
358	totals since the inception of the program as compared to
359	projections; and
360	(1) A statement from the Department of Transportation
361	regarding the status of the funding of the program based on agency
362	cost experience and projections for the future.
363	The report shall be deemed submitted when ten (10) copies are
364	submitted to the Clerk of the House of Representatives and ten
365	(10) copies are submitted to the Secretary of the Senate.
366	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
367	and after July 1, 2002.
