SENATE BILL NO. 2177

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9-11-27, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 ESTABLISH A MINIMUM SALARY TO BE PAID TO THE JUSTICE COURT CLERKS; 3 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** Section 9-11-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

7 9-11-27. The board of supervisors of each county shall, at its own expense, appoint one (1) person to serve as clerk of the 8 justice court system of the county, and may appoint such other 9 employees for the justice court of the county as it deems 10 necessary, including a person or persons to serve as deputy clerk 11 or deputy clerks. The board of supervisors of each county with 12 13 two (2) judicial districts may, at its own expense, appoint two (2) persons to serve as clerks of the justice court system of the 14 county, one (1) for each judicial district, and may appoint such 15 other employees for the justice court system of the county as it 16 deems necessary including persons to serve as deputy clerks. The 17 clerk and deputy clerks shall be empowered to file and record 18 actions and pleadings, to receive and receipt for monies, to 19 20 acknowledge affidavits, to issue warrants in criminal cases upon 21 direction by a justice court judge in the county, to approve the sufficiency of bonds in civil and criminal cases, to certify and 22 issue copies of all records, documents and pleadings filed in the 23 justice court and to issue all process necessary for the operation 24 of the justice court. The clerk or deputy clerks may refuse to 25 26 accept a personal check in payment of any fine or cost or to 27 satisfy any other payment required to be made to the justice

court. All orders from the justice court judge to the clerk of 28 the justice court shall be written. All cases, civil and 29 criminal, shall be assigned by the clerk to the justice court 30 judges of the county in the manner provided in Section 11-9-105 31 32 and Section 99-33-2. A deputy clerk who works in an office separate from the clerk and who is the head deputy clerk of the 33 separate office may be designated to be trained as a clerk as 34 provided in Section 9-11-29. Each justice court clerk shall 35 receive as full compensation for his services an annual salary of 36 not less than Twenty-four Thousand Dollars (\$24,000.00). 37 The 38 salary shall be payable by warrant drawn by the clerk of the board of supervisors on the general fund of the county. 39 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 40

41 and after July 1, 2002.
