SENATE BILL NO. 2184 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE DISPOSITION OF LOST, STOLEN, 2 ABANDONED OR MISPLACED PERSONAL PROPERTY BY COUNTY BOARDS OF 3 SUPERVISORS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The board of supervisors of any county, upon the 5 receipt of recovery of any lost, stolen, abandoned or misplaced 6 personal property by the sheriff or other law enforcement officers 7 8 of the county, shall cause to be posted, in three (3) public places in the county, notice that such property has been received 9 or recovered. Such notice shall contain an accurate and detailed 10 description of such property and, if the board of supervisors is 11 advised as to who owns the property, a copy of the notice shall be 12 13 mailed to such person or persons in addition to being posted as required in this section. The owner may recover the property by 14 filing a claim with the board of supervisors and establishing his 15 right to the property. The board may require bond of the person 16 claiming the property before delivering it to him. Parties having 17 adverse claims to the property may proceed according to law. 18

If no person claims the property within one hundred twenty 19 20 (120) days from the date the notice is given, the board of 21 supervisors shall cause the property to be sold at public auction to the highest bidder for cash after first posting notice of the 22 sale in three (3) public places in the county at least ten (10) 23 days before the date of the sale. The notice shall contain a 24 detailed and accurate description of the property to be sold and 25 26 shall be addressed to the unknown owners or other persons interested in the property to be sold. The notice shall also set 27

forth the date, time and place the sale is to be conducted and shall designate the sheriff to make the sale.

However, lost, stolen, abandoned or misplaced motor vehicles and bicycles may be sold in the manner provided in the preceding paragraph after the expiration of ninety (90) days from their receipt or recovery by law enforcement officers of the county.

The sheriff, promptly upon completion of the sale, shall 34 deliver to the chancery clerk a copy of the notice authorizing the 35 sale, a list of the property sold, the amount paid for each item, 36 the person to whom each item was sold, and all monies received 37 38 from such sale. The clerk then shall deposit the monies into the county treasury and the proceeds of the sale shall be first 39 40 applied to the necessary costs and expenses of the sale, with the remainder to be credited to the special supplemental budget of the 41 sheriff to be expended by the sheriff for any law enforcement 42 purpose upon approval of the board of supervisors. The chancery 43 clerk shall file the information concerning the sale among the 44 45 other records of his office. If, within ninety (90) days after the date of the sale, any person claims to be the owner of the 46 47 property sold, the board, upon satisfactory proof of ownership, shall pay to such person the amount for which the property was 48 49 sold, and the board may require of such person a bond in such cases as the board deems advisable. No action shall be maintained 50 against the county or any of its officers or employees or the 51 purchaser at the sale for any property sold or the proceeds 52 therefrom after the expiration of ninety (90) days from the date 53 of the sales as authorized in this section. 54

55 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 56 and after July 1, 2002.
