SENATE BILL NO. 2249 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-13-133, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO PROVIDE THAT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL EMPLOY A 2 3 PHYSICAL ACTIVITY COORDINATOR K-12 SUBJECT TO THE AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS; TO CODIFY NEW SECTION 37-13-134, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE LEGISLATIVE INTENT REGARDING PHYSICAL EDUCATION CLASSES 4 5 IN SCHOOL DISTRICTS IN GRADES K-9; TO SPECIFY THE MINIMUM 6 QUALIFICATIONS OF THE PHYSICAL ACTIVITY COORDINATOR; TO REQUIRE 7 THE PHYSICAL ACTIVITY COORDINATOR TO PRESENT A STATE PHYSICAL 8 ACTIVITY PLAN EACH YEAR; TO REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF 9 EDUCATION TO CONDUCT A STUDY AND SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE HOUSE AND 10 11 SENATE EDUCATION COMMITTEES ON THE CORRELATION BETWEEN PHYSICAL ACTIVITY AND CLASSROOM PERFORMANCE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 12 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 37-13-133, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 14 amended as follows: 15 37-13-133. Under the provisions of Section 37-13-131, the 16 State Department of Education may provide for the services of a 17 School Health Services Coordinator, School Instruction 18 Coordinator, School Environmental Specialist, * * * and such other 19 professional and nonprofessional staff as may be needed and as 20 funds available to the department will permit. The State 21 Department of Education, subject to the availability of funds 22 specifically for such purpose, shall employ a physical activity 23 coordinator K-12 not later than sixty (60) days after receipt of 24 such funds, in accordance with the provisions of Section 25 37-13-134. It shall be the responsibility of that professional 26 staff to coordinate efforts of the personnel of the State 27 Department of Education, the state's colleges and universities, 28 local public schools and other appropriate agencies to provide the 29 30 comprehensive health education curriculum. SECTION 2. The following shall be codified as Section 31 32 37-13-134, Mississippi Code of 1972:

No. 2249 02/SS01/R583SG PAGE 1 33 <u>37-13-134.</u> (1) The Legislature recognizes that there is a 34 problem with Mississippi student inactivity and obesity in the 35 elementary school years, and therefore recommends the following 36 guidelines for school district physical education and fitness 37 classes: Grades Kindergarten through Six: thirty (30) minutes 38 per day; Grades Seven through Nine: two (2) hours per week.

39 (2) Until such time that state-source funds can be
40 appropriated, it is the intention of the Legislature that the
41 State Department of Education make application for any federal
42 funds available to implement this recommendation and to employ a
43 physical activity coordinator.

44 (3) The physical activity coordinator employed under Section
45 37-13-133 must have the qualifications prescribed in any of the
46 following paragraphs, which are listed in the order of preference:

47 (a) A doctorate in physical education, exercise science
48 or a highly related field, and at least three (3) years of
49 experience in teaching physical education in grades K-12 or in
50 physical activity promotion/fitness leadership; or

51 (b) A master's degree in physical education, exercise 52 science or a highly related field, and at least five (5) years of 53 experience in teaching physical education in grades K-12 or in 54 physical activity promotion/fitness leadership; or

(c) A bachelor's degree in physical education, a teacher's license, and at least seven (7) years of experience in teaching physical education in grades K-12 or in physical activity promotion/fitness leadership.

(4) The Governor's Commission on Physical Fitness and Sports created under Section 7-1-551 et seq., the Mississippi Council on Obesity Prevention and Management created under Section 41-101-1 et seq., the Task Force on Heart Disease and Stroke Prevention created under Section 41-103-1 et seq., the Mississippi Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance, and the Mississippi Alliance for School Health shall provide

S. B. No. 2249 02/SS01/R583SG PAGE 2 66 recommendations to the State Department of Education regarding the 67 employment of the physical activity coordinator. The department 68 shall consider the recommendations of those entities in employing 69 the physical activity coordinator.

(5) The physical activity coordinator shall present a state
physical activity plan each year to the Governor's Commission on
Physical Fitness and Sports, the Mississippi Council on Obesity
Prevention and Management, the Task Force on Heart Disease and
Stroke Prevention, and the Mississippi Alliance for School Health.
(6) The physical activity coordinator shall monitor the

76 districts for adherence to current Mississippi school 77 accountability standards and for implementation of the physical 78 education curriculum on file with the State Department of 79 Education.

The State Department of Education shall conduct a study (7) 80 on the correlation between physical activity or exercise and 81 classroom performance. The study must include recommendations for 82 83 the implementation of a healthy schools program. The department shall submit a report on the results of the study, including 84 recommendations for legislation, to the chairmen of the Education 85 Committees of the House of Representatives and the Senate before 86 87 December 1, 2002.

88 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 89 and after July 1, 2002.
