- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 4 SECTION 1. (1)(a) There is hereby created the Mississippi
- Commission on Human Rights. The commission shall be composed of 5
- thirteen (13) members to be appointed as follows: 6
- 7 (i) Five (5) members shall be appointed by the
- 8 Governor.
- 9 Five (5) members shall be appointed by the
- Lieutenant Governor. 10
- 11 (iii) Three (3) members shall be appointed by the
- Attorney General. 12
- The members of the commission shall be women and 13
- men of recognized ability and achievement who are representative 14
- of the ethnic and cultural diversity of the population of this 15
- state. Members shall serve for terms of four (4) years each, and 16
- no member may serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms. All 17
- vacancies shall be filled by the appointing authority for the 18
- unexpired term. 19
- 20 (C) The commission shall elect a chairman, vice
- chairman and secretary from among its members for terms of two (2) 21
- years each, and any member is eligible for successive elections to 22
- 23 office.
- A quorum for transacting business shall be a 24

- 25 majority of the members of the commission.
- (e) Members of the commission shall be reimbursed for 26
- expenses as provided in Section 25-3-41, Mississippi Code of 1972, 27

- 28 and shall receive per diem as provided in Section 25-3-69,
- 29 Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 30 (f) The Lieutenant Governor and the Attorney General
- 31 shall notify the Governor after they have made their appointments,
- 32 and the Governor shall then designate a place and time for the
- 33 initial organizational meeting of the commission.
- 34 (2) The commission shall have the powers and authority
- 35 necessary to carry out the duties imposed upon it by this act,
- 36 including, but not limited to, the following:
- 37 (a) To employ such administrative, technical and other
- 38 personnel as may be necessary for the performance of its powers
- 39 and duties;
- 40 (b) To hold hearings, make and sign any agreements and
- 41 do or perform any acts which may be necessary, desirable or proper
- 42 to carry out the purposes of this act;
- (c) To cooperate with any state agency, authority,
- 44 board, commission, department or institution to facilitate its
- 45 implementation of the powers and duties granted to the commission
- 46 in this act; and each such state agency, authority, board,
- 47 commission, department or institution shall cooperate with the
- 48 commission in the performance of its duties;
- 49 (d) To appoint advisers or advisory committees, from
- 50 time to time, when the commission determines that the experience
- or expertise of such advisers or advisory committees is needed for
- 52 projects of the commission; and
- (e) To apply for and accept funds, grants, gifts and
- 54 services from the state, the government of the United States or
- 55 any of its agencies, or any other public or private source, for
- 56 the purpose of defraying clerical and administrative costs as may
- 57 be necessary in carrying out its duties under this act.
- 58 (3) (a) The commission shall study the following:
- (i) Educational and employment problems, needs and
- 60 opportunities;

- 63 property rights, marriage and dissolution of marriage provisions,
- 64 and similar matters;
- (iii) The effect of social attitudes and pressures
- and economic considerations in shaping public policy; and
- 67 (iv) Any laws, practices or conditions which
- 68 impose special limitations or burdens upon women, minorities or
- 69 society, or which limit or tend to limit available opportunities.
- 70 (b) The commission shall act as an information center
- 71 on the status of human rights, educational, employment and other
- 72 related needs.
- 73 (c) The commission shall recommend, develop, prepare or
- 74 coordinate materials, projects or other activities and shall give
- 75 technical and consultative advice to public or private groups or
- 76 persons concerned with any of the following:
- 77 (i) Preventing or minimizing problems brought
- 78 about by the changing roles and responsibilities; and
- 79 (ii) Developing programs to encourage and enable
- 80 all persons to be fully contributing members of society.
- 81 (d) The commission may encourage organizations and
- 82 other groups to institute local self-help activities designed to
- 83 meet educational, employment and related needs.
- 84 (4) The commission shall make a report to the Legislature at
- 85 the close of each fiscal year on its activities, findings and
- 86 recommendations.
- 87 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 88 and after July 1, 2002.
