- Occupational Health and Safety Technologist (OHST) unless he has 17
- been jointly certified as such by the Board of Certified Safety 18
- Professionals and the American Board of Industrial Hygiene. 19
- No person may represent himself to the public as a 20
- Construction Health and Safety Technologist (CHST) unless he has 21
- been jointly certified as such by the Board of Certified Safety 22
- Professionals and the American Board of Industrial Hygiene. 23
- No person may represent himself to the public as a 24
- Certified Hazardous Material Manager (CHMM) unless he has been 25
- certified by the Institute of Hazardous Materials Management and 26
- 27 such certification has not lapsed.

- and after July 1, 2002. 29
