SENATE BILL NO. 2321 (As Passed the Senate)

AN ACT TO CODIFY SECTION 37-13-6, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO PROVIDE THAT THE UNITED STATES FLAG SHALL BE DISPLAYED IN EACH 2 3 PUBLIC SCHOOL CLASSROOM AT ALL TIMES WHILE SCHOOL IS IN SESSION; TO REQUIRE EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT TO PROVIDE STUDENT INSTRUCTION IN 4 THE PROPER ETIQUETTE TOWARD, CORRECT DISPLAY OF, AND RESPECT FOR 5 THE FLAG, AND IN PATRIOTIC EXERCISES; TO REQUIRE THE DAILY 6 7 RECITATION OF THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE UNITED STATES FLAG AT THE BEGINNING OF THE FIRST HOUR OF CLASS; AND FOR RELATED 8 9 PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. The following provision shall be codified as Section 37-13-6, Mississippi Code of 1972:

37-13-6. (1) The flag of the United States shall be 13 displayed in close proximity to the school building, on a proper 14 staff, at all times during the hours of daylight when the school 15 16 is in session when the weather will permit without damage to the In addition, the flag of the United States shall be 17 flaq. displayed in each classroom and in each principal room of the 18 school building at all times while school is in session. It shall 19 be the duty of the school boards of each school district to 20 21 provide for the flags, proper flag staffs and their proper display. Each school district shall provide student instruction 22 in the proper etiquette toward, correct display of, and respect 23 24 for the flag, and in patriotic exercises. The instruction shall be a part of the district's fifth grade social studies curriculum 25 or history curriculum, with the assistance of the State Department 26 of Education. 27

(2) From and after July 1, 2002, the school boards of all
public schools of this state shall require the teachers under
their control to have all pupils repeat the oath of allegiance to

S. B. No. 2321 02/SS06/R325PS PAGE 1 31 the flag of the United States of America at the beginning of the 32 first hour of class each day school is in session, such oath of 33 allegiance being as follows:

34 "I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of 35 America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation under 36 God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

Any student or teacher who objects to reciting the oath of allegiance shall be excused from participating without penalty. **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2002.
