SENATE BILL NO. 2321 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO CODIFY SECTION 37-13-6, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE UNITED STATES FLAG SHALL BE DISPLAYED IN EACH 3 PUBLIC SCHOOL CLASSROOM AT ALL TIMES WHILE SCHOOL IS IN SESSION; TO REQUIRE EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT TO PROVIDE STUDENT INSTRUCTION IN THE PROPER ETIQUETTE TOWARD, CORRECT DISPLAY OF, AND RESPECT FOR THE FLAG, AND IN PATRIOTIC EXERCISES; TO REQUIRE THE DAILY 6 RECITATION OF THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE UNITED STATES FLAG 7 AT THE BEGINNING OF THE FIRST HOUR OF CLASS; TO AMEND SECTION 37-13-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO 8 9 FLY THE UNITED STATES FLAG AT HALF-STAFF WHENEVER A PRESIDENTIAL 10 11 ORDER OR INSTRUCTIONS OR FEDERAL LAW REQUIRES THE FLAG TO BE LOWERED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. The following provision shall be codified as

- Section 37-13-6, Mississippi Code of 1972: 15
- 37-13-6. (1) The flag of the United States shall be 16
- displayed in close proximity to the school building, on a proper 17
- staff, at all times during the hours of daylight when the school 18
- is in session when the weather will permit without damage to the 19
- flag. In addition, the flag of the United States shall be 20
- displayed in each classroom and in each principal room of the 21
- school building at all times while school is in session. It shall 22
- be the duty of the school boards of each school district to 23
- provide for the flags, proper flag staffs and their proper 24
- display. Each school district shall provide student instruction 25
- in the proper etiquette toward, correct display of, and respect 26
- for the flag, and in patriotic exercises. The instruction shall 27
- be a part of the district's fifth grade social studies curriculum 28
- or history curriculum, with the assistance of the State Department 29
- 30 of Education.
- 31 (2) From and after July 1, 2002, the school boards of all
- public schools of this state shall require the teachers under 32

- 33 their control to have all pupils repeat the oath of allegiance to
- 34 the flag of the United States of America at the beginning of the
- 35 first hour of class each day school is in session, such oath of
- 36 allegiance being as follows:
- "I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of
- 38 America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation under
- 39 God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."
- Any student or teacher who objects to reciting the oath of
- 41 allegiance shall be excused from participating without penalty.
- 42 SECTION 2. Section 37-13-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 43 amended as follows:
- 44 37-13-5. (1) The flag of the State of Mississippi and the
- 45 flag of the United States shall be displayed in close proximity to
- 46 the school building at all times during the hours of daylight when
- 47 the school is in session when the weather will permit without
- 48 damage to the flag. It shall be the duty of the board of trustees
- 49 of the school district to provide for the flags and their display.
- 50 (2) Whenever the flag of the United States is to be flown at
- 51 half-staff by order or instructions of the President or pursuant
- 52 to federal law, all public schools shall lower the United States
- 53 flag in accordance with the executive order or instructions or
- 54 federal law. The school shall announce the reason that the flag
- is being flown at half-staff to all students in assembly or by
- 56 teachers in the various classrooms or by prominently displaying
- 57 written notice throughout the school stating the reason that the
- 58 flag has been lowered.
- 59 (3) In all public schools there shall be given a course of
- 60 study concerning the flag of the United States and the flag of the
- 61 State of Mississippi. The course of study shall include the
- 62 history of each flag and what they represent and the proper
- 63 respect therefor. There $\underline{\text{also}}$ shall * * * be taught in the public
- 64 schools the duties and obligations of citizenship, patriotism,
- 65 Americanism and respect for and obedience to law.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
