## SENATE BILL NO. 2385 (As Passed the Senate)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE THAT A VEHICLE WITH A SPECIAL DISABLED PERSON'S LICENSE 3 PLATE OR A DISABLED VETERAN LICENSE PLATE ISSUED UNDER SECTION 4 27-19-53 THAT IS BEING USED TO TRANSPORT DISABLED PERSONS MAY PARK 5 IN AN AREA SET ASIDE FOR PERSONS WHO ARE DISABLED WITHOUT 6 DISPLAYING A WINDSHIELD PLACARD; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

10 27-19-56. (1) Upon application by any legal resident of the State of Mississippi with a disability which limits or impairs the 11 ability to walk, the State Tax Commission shall prepare and issue 12 through the county tax collectors a special license plate bearing 13 the International Symbol of Access adopted by Rehabilitation 14 International in 1969 at its Eleventh World Congress on 15 Rehabilitation of the Disabled for not more than one (1) vehicle 16 that is registered in the applicant's name. The initial 17 application shall be accompanied by the certification of a 18 licensed physician that (a) the applicant meets the definition of 19 persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to 20 walk; and (b) that the physician has determined that the applicant 21 will have the disability for at least three (3) years. The State 22 Tax Commission shall prepare and issue to the tax collectors of 23 the various counties, decals for placement on the special license 24 The decals shall bear thereon the month in which the 25 plates. license plate was issued and the year in which the special license 26 27 plate will expire. The special license plate issued under this section is valid for the period of time that the license tag 28 attached upon a motor vehicle is issued pursuant to Section 29 S. B. No. 2385 G1/2

27-19-31(1). A person to whom the special license plate is issued 30 31 may retain the special license plate and may renew it by submitting to the county tax collector, on or before its 32 33 expiration, the certification of a licensed physician that the 34 physician has determined (a) that the applicant meets the 35 definition of a person with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk; and (b) that the applicant will have the 36 disability for at least three (3) years. If an applicant fails to 37 renew the special license plate before its date of expiration, 38 then he shall surrender the special license plate to the county 39 40 tax collector and the tax collector shall issue to such person a regular license plate to replace the special license plate. 41 The terms "vehicle" and "motor vehicle," as used in this 42

42 The terms venicle and motor venicle, as used in this 43 section, includes motorcycles.

The term "persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk" when used in this section means those persons who, as determined by a licensed physician:

47 (a) Cannot walk two hundred (200) feet without stopping48 to rest; or

49 (b) Cannot walk without the use of, or assistance from,
50 a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic device,
51 wheelchair, or other assistive device; or

(c) Are restricted by lung disease to such an extent that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one (1) second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one (1) liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty (60) mm/hg on room air at rest; or

(d) Use portable oxygen; or

(e) Have a cardiac condition to the extent that the
person's functional limitations are classified in severity as
Class III or Class IV according to standards set by the American
Heart Association; or

62 (f) Are severely limited in their ability to walk due63 to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic condition.

An applicant for a special license plate bearing the International Symbol of Access shall not be required to pay any fee or charge for the issuance of such license plate separate from or in addition to the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad valorem taxes and registration fees otherwise required by law to be paid for the issuance of a regular license plate for such vehicle.

70 (2) The State Tax Commission shall prepare removable windshield placards and such placards shall be issued and 71 72 periodically renewed upon the applications of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk. 73 The 74 placards shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through the offices of the tax collectors of the counties. 75 The initial application shall be accompanied by the certification of a 76 77 licensed physician that the applicant meets the definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to 78 79 walk. These placards shall be valid for a period of three (3) years from their date of issue and may be renewed in the same 80 81 manner as provided for the renewal of the special license plates under subsection (1) of this section. The removable windshield 82 83 placard must be displayed on the left side of the vehicle dashboard. The State Tax Commission shall prescribe the placement 84 for motorcycles. 85

86 (3) The State Tax Commission shall provide for the issuance of a temporary removable windshield placard, upon the application 87 88 of a person with a disability which limits or impairs the ability Temporary removable windshield placards authorized by 89 to walk. this subsection shall be prepared by the State Tax Commission and 90 shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through the offices 91 of the tax collectors of the counties. Application for a 92 93 temporary removable windshield placard must be accompanied by the certification of a licensed physician that the applicant meets the 94 

definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the 95 ability to walk. The certification shall also include the period 96 of time that the physician determines the applicant will have the 97 disability, not to exceed six (6) months. The temporary removable 98 99 windshield placard must be displayed on the left side of the 100 vehicle dashboard. The temporary removable windshield placard shall be valid for a period of time for which the physician has 101 determined that the applicant will have the disability, not to 102 exceed six (6) months from the date of issuance. The State Tax 103 Commission shall prescribe the placement for motorcycles. 104

105 (4) The removable windshield placard and the temporary106 removable windshield placard shall be two-sided and shall include:

(a) The International Symbol of Access, which is at least three (3) inches in height, centered on the placard (the color of the removable windshield placard shall be white on a blue shield; and the temporary removable windshield placard shall be white on a red shield);

(b) An identification number and, on the reverse side,the name of the individual to whom the placard is issued;

114 (c) A date of expiration, which shall be entered on the115 placard by the tax collector; and

116 (d) The seal of the State of Mississippi. (5) It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle in an (a) 117 area set aside for persons who are disabled if the motor vehicle 118 119 does not (i) have displayed the removable windshield placard authorized in this section, (ii) have the special license plate 120 121 issued under this section properly displayed upon the motor vehicle, or (iii) have the disabled American veteran tag or plate 122 issued under Section 27-19-53 properly displayed upon the motor 123 vehicle. Any person who unlawfully parks a motor vehicle in such 124 125 areas, or who blocks such spaces or access thereto, shall be 126 guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each such 127 

violation. For the third and subsequent offenses under this section, the offender's driver's license shall be suspended for ninety (90) days by the Commissioner of Public Safety in accordance with Section 63-1-53 in addition to any fine imposed. The court shall not suspend or reduce any fine required to be imposed under this subsection.

A person who is charged with a violation of this 134 (b) section by parking a motor vehicle in an area set aside for 135 persons who are disabled and failing properly to display (i) a 136 removable windshield placard on the dash of the vehicle, (ii) a 137 138 special license plate issued under this section upon the vehicle or (iii) a disabled American veteran tag or plate issued under 139 Section 27-19-53 upon the vehicle shall not be convicted and shall 140 have the charge dismissed upon presentation to the court of proof 141 by means of sworn oral testimony or sworn affidavit that at the 142 time of the charged violation he or a passenger in the vehicle 143 possessed a valid removable windshield placard issued under this 144 145 section.

146 (6) Any person who, for the purpose of obtaining a special 147 license plate or windshield placard under this section, files with 148 the county tax collector a physician's certification, knowing the 149 certification to be false or to have been fraudulently obtained, 150 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be 151 fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

152 (7) All law enforcement officers are authorized to enforce this section on public and private property. Provision of spaces 153 154 restricted to handicapped parking and proper marking of such spaces shall be considered as intent and permission to enforce 155 such designated parking on private property. Only areas marked in 156 157 accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines or equivalent standards shall be enforced. Spaces 158 159 shall bear the International Symbol of Access.

No. 2385 02/SS26/R488PS PAGE 5 Motor vehicles displaying a special license plate, 160 (8) license plate decal, placard or parking certificate or permit 161 bearing the International Symbol of Access issued to a person with 162 163 a disability by any other state or district subject to the laws of 164 the United States shall be allowed the special parking privileges under this section provided the license plate, decal, placard, 165 permit or certificate bears the International Symbol of Access and 166 167 is displayed in a prominent place on the vehicle.

(9) Parking in any area set aside for persons who are
disabled is limited to vehicles which, immediately before or after
the utilization of such an area, are used to transport a person
with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk.
The identification required to park in such an area, except as
provided in subsection (8) of this <u>section</u>, is as follows:

(a) For a vehicle used to transport a person with a
permanent disability, that person's permanent windshield placard
must be displayed <u>or the vehicle must have a special license tag</u>
issued under this section or Section 27-19-53 properly displayed.

(b) For a vehicle being used by a person who has a
temporary disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk,
or which is being used to transport such a person, a temporary
windshield placard must be displayed.

<u>Any person who parks in an area set aside for persons who are</u>
 <u>disabled in violation of this subsection shall be punished as</u>
 <u>provided for in subsection (5) of this section.</u>

(10) Upon application by a nursing home, retirement home or other institution that transports disabled persons, the State Tax Commission may issue the special license plate authorized pursuant to this section for not more than one (1) vehicle that is registered in the applicant's name that is used to transport disabled residents of the institution. Such institution shall comply with all other laws regarding the registration of such

193 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 194 and after July 1, 2002.
