SENATE BILL NO. 2582

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-15-46, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE COMMERCIAL OYSTER HARVESTER NOT SELLING OYSTERS TO MISSISSIPPI DEALER TO PAY SHELL RETENTION FEE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 49-15-46, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

8 49-15-46. (1) Each in-state vessel used to catch, take, 9 carry or transport oysters from the reefs of the State of 10 Mississippi, or engaged in transporting any oysters in any of the 11 waters within the territorial jurisdiction of the State of 12 Mississippi, for commercial use, shall annually, before beginning 13 operations, be licensed by the commission and pay the following 14 license fee:

(a) Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) on all vessels or boats
utilized for tonging oysters or gathering oysters by hand; or

17 (b) One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) on all vessels or18 boats utilized for dredging oysters.

(2) Each out-of-state vessel used to catch, take, carry or 19 transport oysters from the reefs of the State of Mississippi, or 20 engaged in transporting any oysters in any of the waters within 21 the territorial jurisdiction of the State of Mississippi, for 22 commercial use, must annually, before beginning operations, be 23 licensed by the commission and pay the following license fee: 24 One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) on all vessels or 25 (a) 26 boats utilized for tonging oysters or gathering oysters by hand; 27 or

Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) on all vessels or (b) 28 boats utilized for dredging oysters. 29

All oysters harvested in the State of Mississippi shall 30 (3) be taqqed. Tags shall be issued by the department and shall bear 31 32 the catcher's name, the date and origin of the catch, the shell stock dealer's name and permit number. The department shall 33 number all tags issued and shall maintain a record of those tags. 34 The commission, in its discretion, may adopt any regulations 35 regarding the tagging of oysters and other shellfish. 36

Each person catching or taking oysters from the waters 37 (4)38 of the State of Mississippi for personal use shall obtain a permit from the commission and pay an annual recreational oyster permit 39 fee of Ten Dollars (\$10.00). Oysters caught under a recreational 40 permit shall not be offered for sale. The limits on the allowable 41 catch of oysters for recreational purposes shall be three (3) 42 sacks per week. The department shall issue tags of a 43 44 distinguishing color to designate recreationally harvested 45 oysters, which shall be tagged on the same day of harvest in the manner prescribed in subsection (3) of this section for 46 47 commercially harvested oysters or by regulation of the commission.

The commission shall assess and collect a shell 48 (5)retention fee for the shells taken from waters within the 49 territorial jurisdiction of the State of Mississippi as follows: 50

Commercial and recreational harvesters - Fifteen 51 (a) 52 Cents (15¢) per sack paid to the department on the day of harvest; * * * 53

Initial oyster processor, dealer or factory first 54 (b) purchasing the oysters - Fifteen Cents (15¢) per sack paid to the 55 department no later than the tenth day of the month following the 56 purchase, on forms submitted by the department. 57

(c) Commercial harvesters transporting their catch out 58 59 of the state - Fifty Cents (50¢) per sack paid to the department

60 on the day of harvest, in addition to the fees paid in paragraph 61 (5)(a); and

62 (d) Commercial harvesters not selling their oysters to
63 <u>a Mississippi dealer - Fifteen Cents (15¢) per sack paid to the</u>
64 <u>department on the day of harvest, in addition to fees paid in</u>
65 paragraph (5)(a).

Funds received from the shell retention fee shall be paid into a special fund in the State Treasury to be appropriated by the Legislature for use by the commission to further oyster production in this state, which includes plantings of oysters and/or cultch materials.

During open seasons, oysters may be taken only by hands,tongs and dredges.

73 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 74 and after July 1, 2002.
