SENATE BILL NO. 2589

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-895, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROHIBIT CAMPAIGNING IN A COUNTY COURTHOUSE THAT IS BEING 3 UTILIZED AS A POLLING PLACE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 23-15-895, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

23-15-895. (1) It shall be unlawful for any candidate for 7 8 an elective office, or any representative of such candidate, or for any proponent or opponent of any constitutional amendment, 9 local issue or other measure printed on the ballot to post or 10 distribute cards, posters or other campaign literature within one 11 hundred fifty (150) feet of any entrance of the building wherein 12 13 any election is being held. It shall be unlawful for any candidate or a representative named by him in writing to appear at 14 any polling place while armed or uniformed, nor shall he display 15 any badge or credentials except as may be issued by the manager of 16 the polling place. As used in this section, the term "local 17 issue" shall have the meaning ascribed to such term in Section 18 23-15-375. 19

20 (2) It shall be unlawful for any candidate for an elective 21 office, or any representative of such candidate, or for any 22 proponent or opponent of any constitutional amendment, local issue 23 or other measure printed on the ballot to campaign or to post or 24 distribute cards, posters or other campaign literature within the 25 courthouse of a county when such courthouse is being utilized as a 26 polling place. SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

34 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 35 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 36 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
