## SENATE BILL NO. 2621

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- TRUSTEES MAY DESIGNATE A PERSON TO RECOMMEND TEACHERS FO
- 4 EMPLOYMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 37-29-63, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 37-29-63. The president of any community/junior college, or
- 9 such other person designated or authorized by the board of
- 10 trustees, shall have the power to recommend to the board of
- 11 trustees all teachers to be employed in the district. The
- 12 <u>president</u> may remove or suspend any member of the faculty subject
- 13 to the approval of the trustees. He shall be the general manager
- 14 of all fiscal and administrative affairs of the district with full
- 15 authority to select, direct, employ and discharge any and all
- 16 employees other than teachers; however, the board may make
- 17 provisions and establish policies for leave for faculty members
- 18 and other key personnel.
- 19 The president shall have the authority, subject to the
- 20 provisions of Sections 37-29-1 to 37-29-273 and the approval of
- 21 the trustees, to arrange and survey courses of study, fix
- 22 schedules, and establish and enforce rules and discipline for the
- 23 governing of teachers and students. He shall be the general
- 24 custodian of the property of the district.
- SECTION 2. Section 37-29-67, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 26 amended as follows:
- 27 37-29-67. (1) The duties of the board of trustees shall be
- 28 the general government of the community/junior college and

- 29 directive of the administration thereof. Subject to the
- 30 provisions of Sections 37-29-1 through 37-29-273, the board shall
- 31 have full power to do all things necessary to the successful
- 32 operation of the district and the college or colleges or
- 33 attendance centers located therein to insure educational
- 34 advantages and opportunities to all the enrollees within the
- 35 district. The board of trustees shall be authorized to designate
- 36 a personnel supervisor or other person employed by the district to
- 37 recommend teachers and to transmit such recommendations to the
- 38 board of trustees; however, this authorization shall be restricted
- 39 to no more than two (2) positions for each employment period in
- 40 the district.
- 41 (2) The delineation and enumeration of the powers and
- 42 purposes set out in Sections 37-29-1 through 37-29-273 shall be
- 43 deemed to be supplemental and additional, and shall not be
- 44 construed to restrict the powers of the board of trustees of the
- 45 district or of any college located therein so as to deny to the
- 46 said district and the college or colleges therein the rights,
- 47 privileges, and powers previously authorized by statute.
- 48 (3) The board of trustees shall have the power to contract,
- 49 on a shared-savings, lease or lease-purchase basis, for energy
- 50 efficiency services and/or equipment as prescribed in Section
- 51 31-7-14, not to exceed ten (10) years.
- 52 (4) The board of trustees shall be authorized with the
- 53 approval of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, to
- 54 change the name of the junior college to community college. The
- 55 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall establish
- 56 guidelines for the implementation of any junior college name
- 57 change. Any reference to junior college district in this chapter
- 58 shall hereinafter refer to the junior college district or its
- 59 successor in name as changed by the board of trustees.
- SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 61 and after its passage.
