## SENATE BILL NO. 2661

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-2-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE PAYMENT OF BENEFITS UPON THE DEATH OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS AND FIRE FIGHTERS FROM THE DEATH BENEFITS TRUST FUND; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 45-2-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 45-2-1. (1) Whenever used in this section, the term:
- 9 (a) "Covered individual" means a law enforcement
- 10 officer or fire fighter as defined in this section when employed
- 11 by an employer as defined in this section; it does not include
- 12 employees of independent contractors. "Covered individual" also
- 13 includes volunteer fire fighters.
- 14 (b) "Employer" means a state board, commission,
- 15 department, division, bureau, or agency, or a county, municipality
- 16 or other political subdivision of the state, which employs,
- 17 appoints or otherwise engages the services of covered individuals.
- 18 (c) "Fire fighter" means an individual who is trained
- 19 for the prevention and control of loss of life and property from
- 20 fire or other emergencies, who is assigned to fire-fighting
- 21 activity, and is required to respond to alarms and perform
- 22 emergency actions at the location of a fire, hazardous materials
- 23 or other emergency incident.
- 24 (d) "Law enforcement officer" means any lawfully sworn
- 25 officer or employee of the state or any political subdivision of
- 26 the state whose duties require the officer or employee to
- 27 investigate, pursue, apprehend, arrest, transport or maintain

- 28 custody of persons who are charged with, suspected of committing,
- 29 or convicted of a crime.
- 30 (2) (a) The Department of Public Safety shall make a
- 31 payment, as provided in this section, in the amount of Twenty
- 32 Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) when a law enforcement officer,
- 33 while engaged in the performance of the person's official duties,
- 34 is accidentally or intentionally killed or receives accidental or
- 35 intentional bodily injury that results in the loss of the covered
- 36 individual's life, provided that the killing is not the result of
- 37 suicide and that the bodily injury is not intentionally
- 38 self-inflicted.
- 39 (b) The Department of Public Safety shall make a
- 40 payment, as provided in this section, in the amount of Twenty
- 41 Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) when a fire fighter, while engaged
- 42 in the performance of the person's official duties, is
- 43 accidentally or intentionally killed or receives accidental or
- 44 intentional bodily injury that results in loss of the covered
- 45 individual's life, provided that the killing is not the result of
- 46 suicide and that the bodily injury is not intentionally
- 47 self-inflicted.
- 48 (c) The payment provided for in this subsection shall
- 49 be made to the beneficiary who was designated in writing by the
- 50 covered individual, signed by the covered individual and delivered
- 51 to the employer during the covered individual's lifetime. If no
- 52 such designation is made, then the payment shall be made to the
- 53 surviving child or children and spouse in equal portions, and if
- 54 there is no surviving child or spouse, then to the parent or
- 55 parents. If a beneficiary is not designated and there is no
- 56 surviving child, spouse or parent, then the payment shall be made
- 57 to the covered individual's estate.
- 58 (d) The payment made in this subsection is in addition
- 59 to any workers' compensation or pension benefits and is exempt

- 60 from the claims and demands of creditors of the covered
- 61 individual.
- 62 (3) (a) There is established in the State Treasury a
- 63 special fund to be known as the Law Enforcement Officers and Fire
- 64 Fighters Death Benefits Trust Fund. The trust fund shall be
- 65 funded by an initial appropriation of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 66 (\$200,000.00), and shall be comprised of any additional funds made
- 67 available by the Legislature or by donation, contribution, gift or
- 68 any other source.
- (b) The State Treasurer shall invest the monies of the
- 70 trust fund in any of the investments authorized for the funds of
- 71 the Public Employees' Retirement System under Section 25-11-121,
- 72 and those investments shall be subject to the limitations
- 73 prescribed by Section 25-11-121.
- 74 (c) Unexpended amounts remaining in the trust fund at
- 75 the end of the state fiscal year shall not lapse into the State
- 76 General Fund, and any income earned on amounts in the trust fund
- 77 shall be deposited to the credit of the trust fund.
- 78 (4) The Department of Public Safety shall be responsible for
- 79 the management of the trust fund and the disbursement of death
- 80 benefits authorized under this section. The Department of Public
- 81 Safety shall adopt rules and regulations necessary to implement
- 82 and standardize the payment of death benefits under this section,
- 83 to administer the trust fund created by this section and to carry
- 84 out the purposes of this section.
- 85 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 86 and after July 1, 2002.
