SENATE BILL NO. 2727

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-1-43, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 CLARIFY DUTIES AND POWERS OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF WILDLIFE; AND 3 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 49-1-43, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 49-1-43. (1) The director shall have general supervision 8 and control of all conservation officers, and shall enforce all 9 the laws and regulations of the state relating to wild animals, 10 birds and fish, <u>go upon any property</u>, <u>outside of buildings</u>, <u>in the</u> 11 <u>performance of his duties</u> and shall exercise all necessary powers 12 incident thereto not specifically conferred on the department.

(2) The director, with the approval of the commission, shall
make to the Governor and the Legislature a report covering the
operation of the department for the preceding fiscal year.

16 (3) <u>The executive director shall appoint conservation</u> 17 <u>officers and it</u> shall be the duty of all conservation officers to 18 enforce, and to obey and carry out all instructions and directions 19 of the department with respect to the enforcement of the laws and 20 regulations relating to wild animals, birds and fish <u>as prescribed</u> 21 in this section.

(4) The director and each conservation officer shall have
power, and it shall be the duty of the director and of each
conservation officer:

(a) To execute all warrants and search warrants for a
violation of the laws and regulations relating to wild animals,
birds and fish and to serve subpoenas issued for the examination

28 and investigation or trial of offenses against any of the laws or 29 regulations;

To search where the conservation officer has cause 30 (b) 31 to believe and does believe that animals, birds or fish, or any 32 parts thereof, or the nest or eggs of birds, or spawn or eggs of 33 fish are possessed in violation of law or regulation and in such case to examine, without warrant, the contents of any boat, car, 34 automobile or other vehicle, box, locker, basket, creel, crate, 35 game bag or other package, to ascertain whether any law or 36 regulation for the protection of animals, birds or fish have been 37 or are being violated, and to use such force as may be necessary 38 for the purpose of such examination and inspection; 39

40 (c) With a search warrant to search and examine the 41 contents of any dwelling house, room, building or premises of any 42 person suspected of violating any law or regulation, to seize all 43 animals, birds or fish, or parts thereof, or nests or eggs of 44 birds taken in violation of law or regulation, or showing evidence 45 of illegal taking and to seize and confiscate all devices 46 illegally used in taking animals, birds or fish;

(d) To arrest, without warrant, any person committing or attempting to commit a misdemeanor, felony or a breach of the peace within his presence or view and to pursue and so arrest any person committing an offense in any place in the state where the person may go or be; to aid and assist any peace officer of this state or any other state if requested, in manhunts or natural disasters within the state; and

54 (e) To exercise other powers of peace officers in the 55 enforcement of game laws or regulations or of a judgment for the 56 violation thereof, as are not herein specifically provided.

57 (5) In all cases of arrest without warrant, the person 58 making such arrest must inform the accused of the object and cause 59 of the arrest, except when he is in the actual commission of the 60 offense or is arrested on pursuit.

of court any violation of this chapter, or any law or regulation
for the protection of wild animals, birds or fish.

64 (7) Nothing in this section shall be construed as granting65 conservation officers general police powers.

Citations issued by a conservation officer for any 66 (8) violation of the laws for the protection of wild animals, birds 67 and fish, the trespass laws, the litter laws, and the boating laws 68 shall be issued on a uniform citation form consisting of an 69 original and at least two (2) copies. Such citation shall show, 70 71 among other necessary information, the name of the issuing officer, the name of the court in which the cause is to be heard, 72 and the date and time the person charged with a violation is to 73 appear to answer the charge. The uniform citation form shall make 74 75 a provision on it for information that will constitute a complaint charging the offense for which the citation was issued and, when 76 duly sworn to and filed with a court of competent jurisdiction, 77 78 prosecution may proceed under that complaint.

79 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 80 and after its passage.
