## SENATE BILL NO. 2776

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-1-15, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REMOVE EXAMINATION QUALIFICATION FOR CONSERVATION OFFICERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 49-1-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

49-1-15. (1) All appointments of conservation officers
shall be under rules adopted and promulgated by the commission.
No person shall be appointed from and after July 1, 2001, unless
he meets the following requirements:

11 (a) Is at least twenty-one (21) years of age; and 12 \* \* \*

13 (b) Has successfully completed sixty-four (64) semester 14 hours at an accredited community college or university or has an 15 associate degree from an accredited community college or has 16 passed the Law Enforcement Academy and has at least five (5) years 17 experience in law enforcement.

Each applicant, prior to entering into performance of 18 (2) his duties, at the expense of the department, shall attend and 19 20 complete an appropriate curriculum in the field of law enforcement 21 at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy or 22 other training academy whose curriculum complies with requirements of the Board on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Training. 23 Conservation officers shall, on a periodic basis, be required to 24 successfully complete additional advanced courses in law 25 26 enforcement in order that they will be properly improved and trained in the modern, technical advances of law enforcement. 27
