SENATE BILL NO. 2824

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-11-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY PERFORMANCE OF NECESSARY CHEMICAL ANALYSIS OF BLOOD OR BREATH OF THOSE CHARGED WITH DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 63-11-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

63-11-19. A chemical analysis of the person's breath, blood 8 9 or urine, to be considered valid under the provisions of this section, shall have been performed according to methods acceptable 10 to the State Crime Laboratory created pursuant to Section 45-1-17 11 and the Commissioner of Public Safety and performed by an 12 individual possessing a valid permit issued by the State Crime 13 Laboratory for making such analysis. The State Crime Laboratory 14 and the Commissioner of Public Safety are authorized to approve 15 satisfactory techniques or methods, to ascertain the 16 qualifications and competence of individuals to conduct such 17 analyses, and to issue permits which shall be subject to 18 termination or revocation at the discretion of the State Crime 19 Laboratory. The State Crime Laboratory shall not approve the 20 permit required herein for any law enforcement officer other than 21 a member of the State Highway Patrol, a sheriff or his deputies, a 22 23 city policeman, an officer of a state-supported institution of higher learning campus police force, a security officer appointed 24 and commissioned pursuant to the Pearl River Valley Water Supply 25 26 District Security Officer Law of 1978, a national park ranger, a national park ranger technician, a military policeman stationed at 27 a United States military base located within this state other than 28 S. B. No. 2824 G1/2 02/SS02/R219

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a military policeman of the Army or Air National Guard or of 29 Reserve Units of the Army, Air Force, Navy or Marine Corps, a 30 marine law enforcement officer employed by the Department of 31 32 Marine Resources, or a conservation officer employed by the 33 Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks. The permit given a conservation officer or a marine law enforcement 34 officer shall authorize such officer to administer tests only for 35 violations of Sections 59-23-1 through 59-23-7. 36

The State Crime Laboratory shall make periodic, but not less frequently than quarterly, tests of the methods, machines or devices used in making chemical analysis of a person's breath as shall be necessary to ensure the accuracy thereof, and shall issue its certificate to verify the accuracy of the same.

42 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 43 and after its passage.
