SENATE BILL NO. 2922 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO ENACT THE MISSISSIPPI FORESTRY INVENTORY AND 1 STRATEGIC PLANNING ACT OF 2002; TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI INSTITUTE FOR FOREST INVENTORY; TO SPECIFY ITS POWERS AND DUTIES; 2 3 TO ESTABLISH A BOARD OF DIRECTORS FOR THE INSTITUTE; TO PROVIDE 4 FOR THE REPEAL OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. This act shall be known as the "Mississippi Forestry Inventory and Strategic Planning Act of 2002." 8 9 SECTION 2. (1) (a) There is hereby created the Mississippi Institute for Forest Inventory. The institute shall be governed 10 by a board of directors. The board shall consist of eleven (11) 11 members. The Director of the Mississippi Automated Resource 12 Information System; the Executive Director of the Mississippi 13 14 Development Authority, or his designee; the Director of the Forest and Wildlife Research Center at Mississippi State University, or 15 his designee; and the State Forester, or his designee; shall be ex 16 officio members with full voting power. The Governor shall 17 appoint four (4) members with the advice and consent of the 18 19 Senate. The members shall be appointed from the state at large. The Governor shall appoint one (1) member from each of the 20 following categories: a private nonindustrial forest landowner, a 21 22 Mississippi registered forester, a certified wildlife or fisheries biologist, and a representative of an environmental organization. 23 The Lieutenant Governor shall appoint three (3) 24 (b) members from the state at large with the advice and consent of the 25 Senate. The Lieutenant Governor shall appoint one (1) member from 26

27 each of the following categories: the timber harvesting industry,

28 the forest products industry, and a citizen with forestry related 29 interests.

30 (c) Members of the board may be reimbursed for mileage
31 and actual and necessary expenses as provided under Section
32 25-3-41.

The Chairman of the Senate Forestry Committee and 33 (d) the Chairman of the House Agriculture Committee shall serve as 34 members of the Joint Institute for Forest Inventory Oversight 35 Committee. For attending meetings, the legislators shall receive 36 per diem and expenses from their respective contingent expense 37 funds at the rate authorized for committee meetings when the 38 Legislature is not in session. No per diem and expenses will be 39 paid for attending meetings when the Legislature is in session. 40

(2) The board shall appoint a director of the institute whoserves at the will and pleasure of the board.

43 (3) The board shall have the following powers:

(a) To apply for, accept and expend any funds, grants
or gifts from any public or private sources in furtherance of the
institute's duties;

47 (b) To expend funds by appropriation or directly from48 any federal, local or private sources;

49 (c) Enter into contracts and execute all instruments to50 carry out the duties of the institute;

51 (d) To authorize the executive director with the 52 approval of the board to execute all contracts and agreements and 53 to employ such personnel as may be required to carry out the 54 duties of the institute; and

55 (e) To do all acts necessary to carry out the duties of 56 the institute.

57 (4) All funds received by the institute shall be deposited58 in the State Treasury for the use of the institute.

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(a) To facilitate the development and implementation of
a statewide forest resource inventory necessary for a sustainable
forest-based economy on or before July 1, 2004, and thereafter on
a continuing basis with updated published data;

(b) Analyze and publish a detailed report of
Mississippi's forest resource inventory by January 1, 2005;

(c) Conduct and publish data for subsequent and
supporting inventories of forest resources in the years following
the initial full inventory;

(d) Develop policies to aid in the implementation ofthe inventory information and reports;

(e) Submit an annual report to the Legislature on the
institute's funding, expenditures, accomplishments and
recommendations; and

(f) Analyze and publish data on the volume, quality,
size and ownership of forest resources to provide support for new
and existing forest industries.

In accomplishing its duties and formulating the 79 (2)(a) 80 recommendations required of it, the institute may elicit the support of and participation by any commercial, industrial, 81 governmental, environmental, minority and public interest 82 83 organizations or associations, or individual members thereof, and any federal, state and local agencies and political subdivisions 84 85 as may be necessary or appropriate in the furtherance of the activities of the institute. 86

(b) The institute may utilize the services, facilities
and personnel of all departments, agencies, offices and
institutions of the state and all such entities are authorized to
assist the institute and to provide such support.

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SECTION 4. The Executive Directors of the Mississippi 91 Institute for Forest Inventory, the Mississippi Forestry 92 Commission, the Mississippi Development Authority, the MSU Forest 93 94 and Wildlife Research Center, and the Cooperative Extension 95 Service shall establish a procedure and guidelines for the coordination of outreach and education programs. It shall be the 96 duty of each agency to cooperate and to promote a coordinated 97 outreach and education program to increase the utilization of 98 private nonindustrial forest landowner forest resources and 99 increase profitability for such resources. 100

101SECTION 5.This act shall stand repealed on July 1, 2007.102SECTION 6.This act shall take effect and be in force from103and after July 1, 2002.
