COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2966

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-15-21 TO REMOVE REFERENCE TO 1 NONEXISTENT POSITION AND AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE 2 3 DEPARTMENT OF MARINE RESOURCES TO SUPERVISE THE RESERVE OFFICER 4 UNIT; TO CREATE SECTION 49-15-22, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW MARINE PATROL OFFICERS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MARINE RESOURCES 5 TO KEEP SIDE ARM UPON RETIREMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 6

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 49-15-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows: 9

10 49-15-21. (1) The executive director shall appoint the necessary enforcement officers for the administration of this 11 chapter. The salary of all enforcement officers employed shall be 12 as determined by the State Personnel Board. However, the members 13 of the Enforcement Officers' Reserve Unit created in subsection 14 (4) shall serve without pay, and shall not be employees of the 15 State of Mississippi for purposes of the State Personnel System, 16 the Workers' Compensation Law, the Public Employees' Retirement 17 System or the State Employees' Life and Health Insurance Plan. 18

All enforcement officers shall be experienced and 19 (2) 20 qualified persons thoroughly familiar with the seafood business and shall be at least twenty-one (21) years of age and be a high 21 school graduate or its equivalent. The enforcement officers 22 shall diligently enforce all laws and regulations for the 23 24 protection, propagation, preservation or conservation of all saltwater aquatic life of the State of Mississippi, and they are 25 hereby constituted peace officers of the State of Mississippi, 26 with full police power and jurisdiction to enforce all laws of 27 the State of Mississippi and all regulations adopted and 28 29 promulgated by the commission. 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exercise such powers in any county of the State of Mississippi 30 and on any waters of the state, and they are hereby authorized 31 to carry firearms or other weapons, concealed or otherwise, and 32 33 they shall investigate all persons, corporations and otherwise 34 who are alleged to have violated any laws, and make affidavits, 35 arrests and serve papers of any court of competent jurisdiction, in like manner as is provided for sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, 36 when the same shall be in connection with the enforcement of the 37 seafood laws of the State of Mississippi and such other laws and 38 regulations of this state as the commission may designate. 39 The 40 enforcement officers may seize at any time aquatic life caught, taken or transported in a manner contrary to the laws of this 41 42 state, and may confiscate and dispose of the same. Any net or other paraphernalia used or employed in connection with a 43 violation may be seized, and forfeiture proceedings may be 44 instituted * * *. Enforcement officers may draft the aid of 45 captains, crews and boats or licensed vessels to enforce this 46 47 chapter and may, without warrant, board and search vessels or vehicles. The application for any license or permit from the 48 49 commission to catch, fish, take, transport or handle or process any form of aquatic life, or the taking, catching, transporting 50 51 or handling or processing of any and all aquatic life in this state shall constitute acquiescence and agreement upon the part 52 of the owners, captains and crews, employers and dealers to the 53 54 provisions of this chapter and the agreement that enforcement officers may exercise the authority granted under the provisions 55 56 hereof.

57 (3) Prior to entering into performance of their duties or
58 delegations or as soon after appointment as possible, each
59 enforcement officer, at the expense of the commission, shall
60 attend and complete an appropriate curriculum in the field of law
61 enforcement at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training
62 Academy or other law enforcement training program approved under

However, members of the Enforcement Officers' 63 Reserve Unit created in subsection (4) of this section may attend 64 the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy at the 65 66 expense of the commission if it deems the training necessary or 67 desirable. No enforcement officer shall be entitled to payment of salary after the first six (6) months in office if he has either 68 failed to attend the academy or has failed to comply with other 69 70 qualifications or successfully complete any law enforcement qualification examinations as the director deems necessary. 71 The enforcement officers shall, on a periodic basis, be required to 72 73 attend additional advanced courses in law enforcement in order that they will be properly improved and trained in the modern, 74 75 technical advances of law enforcement.

(4) (a) There is hereby created an Enforcement Officers' 76 Reserve Unit, hereinafter termed "the reserve," to assist the 77 enforcement officers in the performance of their duties under this 78 chapter. The reserve shall consist of volunteers who are approved 79 80 by the Executive Director of the Department of Marine Resources, or his designee. * * * The members of the reserve shall serve 81 82 without pay. Reserve officers shall be in such numbers as determined by the enforcement needs, with the maximum strength of 83 84 reserve officers limited to the same number as enforcement officers. 85

(b) To be eligible for membership in the reserve, an 86 87 applicant must be twenty-one (21) years of age, be a high school graduate or its equivalent, be in good physical condition, have a 88 89 Mississippi driver's license, be in good standing with the community, be available for training and duty, not be a member of 90 any police, auxiliary police, civil defense, or private security 91 agency, have never been convicted of a felony, and have one (1) of 92 93 the following:

94 (i) An honorable discharge or honorable separation95 certificate from one (1) of the United States military services;

97 school work experience that required the ability to deal
98 effectively with individuals and groups of persons;
99 (iii) Successful completion of sixty (60) semester
100 hours at an accredited college or university; or
101 (iv) The qualifications as are outlined in this

102 section for enforcement officers.

Members of the immediate family of enforcement officers shall not be eligible for the reserve unless a special waiver is granted.

Upon acceptance into the reserve, members shall receive a temporary appointment for one (1) year. During this year of temporary status, members must successfully complete the required training and must qualify on the same firearms course as enforcement officers.

The reserve shall be under the leadership and 111 (C)direction of the executive director, or his designee. 112 The 113 training of the reserve shall be conducted by an enforcement officer. The reserve shall meet at least once each month for the 114 115 purpose of training and transacting any business as may come before it. The executive director shall be notified in writing of 116 all meetings of the reserve and the time and place of the meetings 117 shall be recorded with the executive director. 118 The executive director shall prepare a reserve officer's manual with the advice 119 120 and consent of the commission. The manual shall include, but is not limited to, the following: activities and operations, 121 training, administration and duties. During active service, the 122 reserve shall be under the direction of the executive director, or 123 his designated representative. When a reserve officer is on 124 125 active duty and assigned to a specific enforcement officer, he shall be under the direct supervision of that officer. Reserve 126 127 officers serve at the discretion of the executive director and may be dismissed by him * * *. Reserve officers shall furnish their 128

S. B. No. 2966 02/SS01/R807CS PAGE 4 129 own uniforms and other personal equipment if the <u>executive</u> 130 director does not provide such items.

(d) The <u>executive director</u> may * * * require members of
the Enforcement Officers' Reserve Unit to attend officer reserve
training programs conducted by county or municipal agencies.

(e) The <u>executive director</u> may issue uniforms to such
reserve officers and may authorize the issuance of any state
equipment necessary for the reserve officers to adequately assist
law enforcement officers. The <u>executive director may</u> develop a
reserve officer identification system to accomplish the issuance
of such items in accordance with the State Auditor guidelines.

If the executive director determines that a member 140 (f) 141 of the Enforcement Officers' Reserve Unit may attend a training program as authorized under this section, it shall require that 142 reserve officer to sign an agreement, prior to attending a 143 training program, which shall stipulate that if the reserve 144 officer accepts employment from any other public or private law 145 146 enforcement agency within three (3) years after completion of his training program, the reserve officer or the respective hiring law 147 148 enforcement agency shall reimburse the department for the total cost of his training program. By October 1 of each year, the 149 150 department shall provide the Conservation and Water Resources Committee of the Mississippi House of Representatives and the 151 Ports and Marine Resources Committee of the Mississippi Senate a 152 153 listing which contains each name and the respective cost of training each reserve officer received during the previous year. 154

155 SECTION 2. The following shall be codified as Section 156 49-15-22, Mississippi Code of 1972:

157 <u>49-15-22.</u> Each person employed as a marine patrol officer by 158 the Mississippi Department of Marine Resources who retires for 159 superannuation or for reason of disability under the Public 160 Employees' Retirement System may, upon his request, be allowed to 161 retain, as his personal property, one (1) side arm which was

164 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 165 and after its passage.
