AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-8, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 ESTABLISH A MINIMUM FEE FOR NONRESIDENT DUCK HUNTING LICENSES AND 2 FRESHWATER FISHING LICENSES; TO DIRECT THE COMMISSION ON WILDLIFE, 3 4 FISHERIES AND PARKS TO CHARGE RECIPROCAL FEES; AND FOR RELATED 5 PURPOSES BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. Section 49-7-8, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 8 49-7-8. (1) No nonresident sixteen (16) years of age or 9 older may hunt, fish, kill, take or trap any game animal, bird or 10 fish without having acquired and having in his immediate 11 possession a valid license issued by the Mississippi Commission on 12 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks. 13 14 (2) The commission shall have the following duties and 15 powers: To prescribe the forms and types of nonresident 16 (a) licenses that a nonresident must obtain; 17 (b) To determine the total number of each type of 18 19 nonresident license to be issued annually; To establish fees for nonresident licenses and the 20 (C) 21 collection fees for the agent issuing such licenses; provided, 22 however, that the fee for a nonresident all game hunting license 23 shall not be less than Sixty Dollars (\$60.00); (d) The fee for the following nonresident licenses 24 shall be Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) for a seven-day duck 25 hunting license, One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) for an annual 26 27 duck hunting license and Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) for an annual

28 freshwater fishing license, unless the commission has a

29 reciprocity agreement with a state.

30 (e) To exercise all incidental powers necessary to
 31 develop a nonresident licensing program.

32 (3) A nonresident who violates this section or any licensing
33 regulation of the commission is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall
34 be punished as provided in Section 49-7-21(3).

35 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 36 and after July 1, 2002.
