## SENATE BILL NO. 3062

1 2 3 4 5	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 23-15-627 AND 23-15-713, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW QUALIFIED ELECTORS TO VOTE BY ABSENTEE BALLOT FOR ANY REASON; TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-653, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE ALL REGISTRARS' OFFICES TO REMAIN OPEN FROM 7 A.M. TO 7 P.M. ON THE THREE SATURDAYS PRIOR TO EACH ELECTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
8	SECTION 1. Section 23-15-627, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
9	amended as follows:
10	23-15-627. The registrar shall be responsible for furnishing
11	an absentee ballot application form to any elector authorized to
12	receive an absentee ballot. Absentee ballot applications shall be
13	furnished to a person only upon the oral or written request of the
14	elector who seeks to vote by absentee ballot; however, the parent,
15	child, spouse, sibling, legal guardian, those empowered with a
16	power of attorney for that elector's affairs or agent of the
17	elector may orally request an absentee ballot application on
18	behalf of the elector. An absentee ballot application must have
19	the seal of the circuit or municipal clerk affixed to it and be
20	initialed by the registrar or his deputy in order to be utilized
21	to obtain an absentee ballot. A reproduction of an absentee
22	ballot application shall not be valid unless it is a reproduction
23	provided by the office of the registrar of the jurisdiction in
24	which the election is being held and which contains the seal and
25	initials required by this section. Such application shall be
26	substantially in the following form:

114	SECTION 2. Section 23-15-713, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
115	amended as follows:
116	23-15-713. For the purpose of this subarticle, any duly
117	qualified elector may vote as provided in this subarticle if he be
118	one who falls within the following categories:
119	(a) Any qualified elector who is a bona fide student,
120	teacher or administrator at any college, university, junior
121	college, high, junior high or elementary grade school whose
122	studies or employment at such institution necessitates his absence
123	from the county of his voting residence on the date of any
124	primary, general or special election, or the spouse and dependents
125	of said student, teacher or administrator if such spouse or
126	dependent(s) maintain a common domicile, outside of the county of
127	his voting residence, with such student, teacher or administrator.

- 128 (b) Any qualified elector who is required to be away
  129 from his place of residence on any election day due to his
  130 employment as an employee of a member of the Mississippi
  131 congressional delegation and the spouse and dependents of such
  132 person if he or she shall be residing with such absentee voter
- 132 person if he or she shall be residing with such absentee voter
- 133 away from the county of the spouse's voting residence.
- 134 (c) Any qualified elector who <u>desires to vote by</u>
- 135 <u>absentee ballot</u> for any reason.
- (d) Any person who has a temporary or permanent
  physical disability and who, because of such disability, is unable
  to vote in person without substantial hardship to himself or
  others, or whose attendance at the voting place could reasonably
- 140 cause danger to himself or others.
- (e) The parent, spouse or dependent of a person with a temporary or permanent physical disability who is hospitalized outside of his county of residence or more than fifty (50) miles distant from his residence, if the parent, spouse or dependent
- 145 will be with such person on election day.
- (f) Any person who is sixty-five (65) years of age or older.
- (g) Any member of the Mississippi congressional
  delegation absent from Mississippi on election day, and the spouse
  and dependents of such member of the congressional delegation.

- SECTION 3. Section 23-15-653, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:
- 23-15-653. All registrars' offices shall remain open <u>from 7</u>
- 155 <u>a.m.</u> until 7 p.m. on the <u>three (3)</u> Saturdays prior to each
- 156 election.
- 157 **SECTION 4.** The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
- 158 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,
- 159 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the
- 160 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States

- 161 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the
- 162 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and
- 163 extended.
- 164 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
- 166 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
