## SENATE BILL NO. 3140

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE AID AND SUPPORT OF THE 1 PUBLIC COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI 2 3 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid and support 7 of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year 8 beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003..... 9 .....\$ 91,253,691.00. 10 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 12 Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 13 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, not otherwise 14 appropriated, for the aid and support of public community and 15 junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and 16 ending June 30, 2003..... \$ 25,253,826.00. 17 SECTION 3. The money appropriated by this act shall be 18 apportioned in accordance with the following assigned weights: 19 20 Formula Section Assigned Weight 21 (1)Aid to Colleges Base 5% of prior year 22 appropriation Academic 1.0 23 Technical 1.19 24 Virtual Community College .55 25 26 (2) Vocational .38 27 (3) Part-time .55

(4) Associate Degree Nursing 1.0

Such Academic, Technical, and Vocational funds shall be 29 disbursed to such public community and junior colleges on the 30 basis of the full-time enrollment of each such public community 31 32 and junior college as of the last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent of the preceding year, counting 33 only students who reside within the State of Mississippi. 34 Part-time academic vocational and technical credit courses may 35 qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time equivalency of 36 part-time and summer students, counting only students who reside 37 38 within the State of Mississippi.

39 Virtual Community College hosted and provided courses may 40 qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time equivalency of 41 virtual community college hours generated during the summer, fall 42 and spring semesters that did not make a student full-time in the 43 fall semester.

The Director of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, or his designee, shall audit each public community and junior college and shall determine who shall be counted in each college and shall certify the number to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.

If, pending determination of the enrollment of students at 49 50 the public community and junior colleges entitled to participate in this appropriation, as provided for in this subsection, the 51 52 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall find and determine that any such public or community junior college does 53 not have sufficient funds on hand for payment of the necessary 54 expenses of its operation for the period commencing 55 July 1, 2002, until distribution of the funds appropriated hereby, 56 57 then, in that event, the State Board for Community and Junior 58 Colleges is expressly authorized to make an advance to any such 59 public community or junior college or colleges not having sufficient operating funds for such period from the funds 60

appropriated hereby; provided, however, that the amount of any 61 62 such advance to any one public community or junior college shall not exceed thirty-three percent (33%) of the amount of state 63 appropriated funds received by such public community or junior 64 65 college during the preceding fiscal year; and provided, further, 66 that the amount of any such advance shall be deducted from the pro rata part of the funds appropriated hereby accruing to said public 67 community or junior college when enrollment has been ascertained 68 and distribution of funds is made. 69

SECTION 4. No part of the amount herein appropriated shall be used by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for administrative or other purposes except in the manner and to the extent authorized in the act making an appropriation for the expenses of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.

75 SECTION 5. The funds disbursed under the provisions of this 76 act shall be accounted for through the State Board for Community 77 and Junior Colleges.

78 SECTION 6. The following public community and junior 79 colleges which qualify shall participate in the funds provided by 80 Sections 1 and 2 of this act:

Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln Community College, 81 82 East Central Community College, East Mississippi Community College, Hinds Community College District, Holmes Community 83 College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior College, 84 85 Meridian Community College, Mississippi Delta Community College, Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College District, Northeast 86 87 Mississippi Community College, Northwest Mississippi Community College, Pearl River Community College, and Southwest Mississippi 88 Community College. 89

90 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that none 91 of the General Funds appropriated herein shall be expended for the 92 purpose of paying salaries, wages, and fringe benefits of any

SECTION 8. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 95 96 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 97 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for 98 Community and Junior Colleges for the purposes of hiring nursing and allied health teachers, awarding interest free nursing and 99 allied health student loans and providing instructional support 100 for the Rural Health Corps for the fiscal year beginning 101 July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003..... \$ 1,200,000.00. 102 103 The funds appropriated in this section shall be allocated as 104 follows:

105 (1) One-half (1/2) divided equally among the fifteen (15)106 public community and junior colleges.

107 (2) One-half (1/2) divided upon the basis of the number of 108 full-time academic, technical and vocational public community and 109 junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the 110 last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent 111 of the preceding year counting only those students who reside 112 within the State of Mississippi.

The public community and junior colleges shall prepare and make available to the Legislature and the Legislative Budget Office an accounting of expenditures and program accomplishments of the Rural Health Corps Program for each of the individual community and junior colleges in a format and manner prescribed by the Legislative Budget Office.

**SECTION 9.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid of the public community and junior colleges, to fund life and health insurance, for all employees of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003.

The funds allocated in this section shall only be used to participate in the State and School Employees' Life and Health Insurance Plan. Any funds appropriated in these sections which are not expended during the fiscal year shall be carried forward for the same purposes during the next succeeding fiscal year.

SECTION 10. In addition to funds appropriated in Section 9, 131 the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is 132 hereby appropriated out of any money in the Insurance Carryover 133 Fund No. 3295, for the purpose of fully funding life and health 134 insurance through the State and School Employees' Life and Health 135 136 Insurance Plan for all qualified community and junior college employees, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending 137 138 June 30, 2003.....\$ 200,000.00.

**SECTION 11.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of establishing and operating One-Stop Career Centers at each of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003...... \$ 4,500,000.00.

SECTION 12. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of Sign Language Interpreter Training at the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003...... \$ 179,050.00.

**SECTION 13.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of the Education Technology Program at the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003...... \$ 3,599,160.00.

SECTION 14. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 159 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 160 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the 161 162 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of 163 defraying the cost of servicing the debt on bonds issued for the Education Technology Program at the community and junior colleges 164 165 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending 166 June 30, 2003..... \$ 3,144,929.00. 167 The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Sections 168

SECTION 15. A Mississippi Prepaid Affordable College Tuition (MPACT) program beneficiary shall be considered a Mississippi resident for the purposes of participating in this appropriation regardless of the beneficiary's residence on the date of enrollment, as set out in Mississippi Code Annotated, Section

27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 18. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 224 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 225 226 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 227 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 228 229 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. SECTION 19. This act shall take effect and be in force from 230 and after July 1, 2002. 231
