AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING 1 THE EXPENSES OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE, 2 AND GRAIN DIVISION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2003. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of 7 8 defraying the expenses of the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce, including the Divisions of Support, Grain and Plant 9 Industry, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending 10 June 30, 2003.....\$ 7,541,823.00. 11 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 12 13 necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special source funds, which are collected by or otherwise become available 14 15 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce, including the Divisions of Support, 16 Grain and Plant Industry, for the fiscal year beginning 17 July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003..... 18 \$ 19 5,075,933.00. 20 The funds authorized for expenditure under the provisions of 21 this section include subscription fees produced from the Market 22 Bulletin and admission fees produced from the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum. 23 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 24 Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall 25 26 be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of 27 expenditure:

53	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
54	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
55	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
56	Services" for Fiscal Year 2004 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2003
57	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs, positions or
58	pay increases are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi
59	Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget
60	Office, the State Personnel Board shall, on July 1, 2002, publish
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separate annual projection reports, based on July 1, 2002 data, 61 for the period of July 1, 2002, through December 31, 2002, and 62 January 1, 2003, through June 30, 2003, that project the annual 63 64 cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with 65 the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases 66 this projected cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2003 appropriation for 67 "Personal Services," as annualized on a semiannual basis in 68 accordance with the provisions of this act. If, at the end of any 69 calendar month, the State Personnel Board determines that the 70 71 agency has taken action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2003 "Personal 72 Services" appropriated level, when annualized in compliance with 73 the provisions of this act, then only those actions which reduce 74 75 the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement 76 will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 77

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 4. The funds appropriated and authorized to be 84 85 expended under the provisions of this act shall be expended for the purpose of defraying all expenses incurred by the State 86 Department of Agriculture and Commerce in the operation of all 87 programs and activities (except operation of the State Lime 88 Plants, Veterinary Laboratory, Pink Bollworm-Plant Quarantine 89 Inspection Stations and Fire Ant Program) authorized to be 90 conducted and carried on by said department; including, but not 91 92 limited to: the administration of the Feed, Fertilizer and Dairy Act; the Weights and Measure Act; the Meat Inspection Act of 1968; 93

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the Mississippi Pure Seed Law; and the following additional 94 95 programs and activities: enforcement of the egg law; publication and distribution of the Mississippi Market Bulletin, agricultural 96 97 statistics, market news service at Stoneville, Mississippi; 98 operation of the grain laboratory; inspection, grading and 99 certifying of fruits, vegetables, hay, grain, meat and meat products, milk and dairy products, pecans, seed, syrup, and port 100 101 grain inspection.

SECTION 5. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce shall, from time to time, adjust the schedule of fees collected under the grain inspection program so that the revenue therefrom equals or exceeds the operational costs of the grain inspection program and the expenses incurred in complying with the requirements of the United States Grain Standards Act, Public Law 94-583.

The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and 109 SECTION 6. Commerce, with the assistance of the State Department of Audit and 110 111 the Department of Finance and Administration, shall establish nonbudgeted enterprise funds for all "for profit" activities 112 113 related to the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum. The funds shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted 114 115 accounting principles and regulations prescribed by the Department of Finance and Administration. 116

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that any regulations promulgated by the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce concerning the labeling of liming materials include the actual analysis of said lime. Nothing in the regulations shall prevent any manufacturer from selling his products to any consumer as long as the labeling is accurate.

123 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 124 State Department of Agriculture and Commerce is hereby authorized 125 to accept, budget and expend funds from any source in accordance 126 with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and

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127 Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of 128 federal funds.

SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be used for the purpose of assisting in carrying out the provisions of the economic development efforts, including, but not limited to, Mississippi Land, Water and Timber Resources Act as set out in House Bill No. 1836, 2002 Regular Session.

SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2, Seventy-five Thousand Eight Hundred Forty-seven Dollars (\$75,847.00) shall be derived from the Budget Contingency Fund created in Section 27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972.

139 SECTION 11. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 140 Treasury to the credit of the Beaver Control Program or from any 141 other special source funds made available to the Beaver Control 142 Program, to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce for the 143 144 support of the Beaver Control Program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003..... 145 146\$ 718,000.00.

Of the special funds authorized in this Section, Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) shall be derived from the Budget Contingency Fund, Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be derived from funds received from the Mississippi Department of Transportation, and Two Hundred Sixty-eight Thousand Dollars (\$268,000.00) shall be derived from counties and from fees charged private persons/organizations.

SECTION 12. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the Debt Retirement Fund No. 392L not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of these funds, originally authorized in Senate Bill No. 3069, 1996 Regular Session, to be used for repairs and/or renovations at the Jim Buck

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Ross Agricultural and Forestry Museum for the fiscal year 160 beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003..... 161 162\$ 182,000.00. 163 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the 164 provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended exceed the unexpended balance as of June 30, 2002. 165 166 SECTION 13. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 167 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 168 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 169 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 170 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 171 SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from 172 173 and after July 1, 2002.
