SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 507

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING
 MISSISSIPPI ETHICS COMMISSION'S LONGTIME EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR RONALD
 E. (RON) CROWE ON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT AFTER 18 YEARS OF
 DEDICATED PUBLIC SERVICE.
 WHEREAS, Ronald E. Crowe has announced he will retire from

6 his position as Executive Director of the Mississippi Ethics
7 Commission effective November 1, 2001; and

8 WHEREAS, Mr. Crowe has served as the Executive Director of 9 the Mississippi Ethics Commission since September 16, 1983. Prior 10 to his appointment as the Ethics Commission's Executive Director, 11 Mr. Crowe served in various positions with the State Tax 12 Commission and as the Assistant Director of the PEER Committee. 13 Mr. Crowe has served 36 consecutive years with the State of 14 Mississippi; and

15 WHEREAS, Walter Brown, Chairman of the Mississippi Ethics 16 Commission, has lauded Ron's legacy of public trust in state 17 government:

"Ron Crowe's service in state government has been exemplified 18 by sound judgment, firmness and impartiality. He has made the 19 Mississippi Ethics Commission an educational tool as well as a law 20 enforcement agency, and has given this agency a statewide 21 reputation for credibility and respect. In his 18 years as 22 Executive Director he has assisted hundreds of state and local 23 officials not only in carrying out the ethics laws, but in 24 affirmatively seeing that conflicts of interest not only can be 25 26 avoided, but that integrity in government is good public policy"; and 27

28 WHEREAS, a resident of Brandon, Mississippi, Ron Crowe is a 29 member of the American Society of Public Administration and the 30 international Council on Governmental Ethics Laws in which he has 31 served as recruiting chairman for the southeastern United States 32 and was a member of a committee which developed the "Model Ethics 33 Act"; and

34 WHEREAS, Ron is a graduate of the first class of the State 35 Executive Institute, he has been featured in numerous newspaper 36 articles regarding his work at the Ethics Commission and he is 37 fondly referred to by many people in and out of government circles 38 as "Mr. Ethics"; and

39 WHEREAS, a native of Columbus, Mississippi, Ron Crowe is 40 married to the former Karen Wilder of Columbus and they have two 41 sons: Shane and Kevin, who are both married; and

42 WHEREAS, government must have the trust of its citizens, and 43 Ron Crowe has often been called the "conscience of state 44 government" due to his longtime oversight of public trust and 45 public interest in Mississippi; and

46 WHEREAS, we are grateful for Ron's legacy of service in state 47 government:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That we do hereby commend and congratulate Mississippi Ethics Commission's longtime Executive Director Ronald E. (Ron) Crowe on the occasion of his retirement after 18 years of dedicated public service, and wish he and his wife, Karen, the best as he returns to private life.
