15 1966, Herrington was an auditor in the Greenwood District for six

16 years and was then Manager of the Tupelo District office for 10

17 years. On March 1, 1982, Lester became Assistant Director of

18 Revenue in the Jackson office, and two years later Administrative

19 Assistant to the Deputy Commissioner, a position he held until

20 assuming his present position as Deputy Commissioner; and

21 WHEREAS, in January 1992, Lester was appointed by Governor

22 Ray Mabus to the Board of Trustees for the Public Employees'

23 Retirement System for the State of Mississippi for the term ending

June 30, 1993. On July 1, 1993, Lester was reappointed to a

June 30, 1997, he served as Chairman of the Board for PERS. On
