## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 518

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION CREATING A JOINT STUDY COMMITTEE TO
STUDY CRIMINAL CODE REFORM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
WHEREAS, the Legislature has determined that a study is
needed for criminal code reform, classification of crimes and
sentencing terms:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF 6 7 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That 8 there is hereby created a special joint study committee to study 9 criminal code reform, classification of crimes and sentencing terms, and make recommendations concerning any changes that such 10 11 committee finds necessary. The joint committee shall be composed of the Chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee, the Chairman of 12 the Senate Corrections Committee, three (3) members of the Senate 13 to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, the Chairman of the 14 House Judiciary Committee En Banc, the Chairman of the House 15 Penitentiary Committee, and three (3) members of the House of 16 Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House. 17 The chairman of the joint committee shall be the Chairman of the 18 Senate Judiciary Committee and the vice chairman shall be the 19 20 Chairman of the House Judiciary Committee En Banc.

Within fifteen (15) days after sine die adjournment of the 21 2002 Regular Session of the Legislature, the Lieutenant Governor 22 and the Speaker shall appoint the members of the committee. After 23 the members are appointed, the joint committee shall meet on a 24 25 date designated by the chairman of the joint committee in Jackson, Mississippi, to organize the committee and establish rules for 26 transacting its business and keeping records. 28 members of the joint committee from each house shall constitute a 29 quorum at all committee meetings. An affirmative vote of a 30 majority of the members from each house shall be required in the 31 adoption of rules, resolutions and reports. All members of the 32 joint committee shall be notified in writing of all regular and 33 special meetings of the committee, which notices shall be mailed 34 at least five (5) days before the dates of the meetings.

The joint committee may establish any subcommittees that it deems desirable to study and report to the committee with respect to any matter that is within the scope of this resolution.

38 The joint committee shall make a written report of its 39 findings and recommendations, and shall mail copies of the report 40 to each member of the Legislature not later than January 5, 2003. 41 Upon the filing of the written report, the joint committee shall 42 be dissolved.

In carrying out the provisions of this resolution, the joint 43 committee may utilize the services, facilities and personnel of 44 45 all departments, agencies, offices and institutions of the state, including the state universities and the community and junior 46 47 colleges. In particular, the joint committee shall consult with the Mississippi Judicial Advisory Study Committee Consulting Group 48 49 on Criminal Code Revision. The joint committee may consult and 50 seek advice from various groups in the state in order to understand the effect of any existing laws or any changes in law 51 52 being considered by the committee.

For attending meetings of the joint committee, each member 53 54 shall be paid from the contingent expense fund of the member's respective house, per diem compensation in the amount authorized 55 by Section 25-3-69 and a mileage allowance and an expense 56 57 allowance in the amount authorized by Section 5-1-47. However, no per diem compensation, mileage allowance or expense allowance 58 59 shall be paid for attending meetings of the joint committee while the Legislature is in session, and no per diem compensation, 60

mileage allowance or expense allowance shall be paid without prior 61 approval of the proper committee in the member's respective house. 62 All expenses incurred by and on behalf of the joint committee 63 shall be paid from funds made available by the House Management 64 65 Committee and the Senate Rules Committee from the contingent expense funds of the respective houses, from any funds 66 appropriated for such purpose, and from any grants or 67 contributions made to the committee for its purpose. 68
