SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 532

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PROPOSING TO AMEND THE MISSISSIPPI 1 CONSTITUTION OF 1890 CREATING A NEW SECTION 255 TO REQUIRE THE 2 3 GOVERNOR TO CALL A SPECIAL SESSION IN THE FIRST YEAR FOLLOWING THE 2000 DECENNIAL CENSUS AND EVERY TEN YEARS THEREAFTER FOR THE 4 PURPOSE OF REDISTRICTING THE CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS OF THIS 5 STATE; TO PROVIDE THAT SUCH REDISTRICTING SHALL BE ACCOMPLISHED BY 6 PASSAGE OF A JOINT RESOLUTION; TO PROVIDE THAT IF THE LEGISLATURE SHALL FAIL TO ADOPT SUCH JOINT RESOLUTION, A FIVE-MEMBER 7 8 COMMISSION COMPOSED OF THE CHIEF JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT AS 9 CHAIRMAN, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, SECRETARY OF STATE, THE SPEAKER OF 10 THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE PRESIDENT PRO TEMPORE OF THE 11 SENATE SHALL CONVENE AND WITHIN THIRTY DAYS OF THE ADJOURNMENT OF 12 SUCH SPECIAL SESSION REDISTRICT THE CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS OF 13 14 THIS STATE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

15 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF 16 MISSISSIPPI, That the following amendment to the Mississippi 17 Constitution of 1890 is proposed to the qualified electors of the 18 state:

Section 255. Not later than October 31 in the first year 19 following the 2010 decennial census and every ten (10) years 20 thereafter, the Governor shall call a special session to 21 redistrict by joint resolution the congressional districts of this 22 state in accordance with all applicable constitutional and 23 statutory law. Such special session shall not exceed thirty (30) 24 consecutive days, during which no other business shall be 25 conducted and it shall be the mandatory duty of the Legislature to 26 adopt a joint resolution redistricting the congressional districts 27 of this state. Should such special session not adopt the joint 28 resolution as required by this section, a five-member commission 29 consisting of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court as chairman, 30 31 the Attorney General, the Secretary of State, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the 32 Senate shall immediately convene and within thirty (30) days of 33 S. 34 the adjournment of such special session redistrict the 35 congressional districts of this state. Such redistricting shall 36 be final upon filing with the Office of the Secretary of State. 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be

38 submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at 39 an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the First Monday 40 of November 2002, as provided by Section 273 of the Constitution 41 and by general law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed 42 amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed 43 constitutional amendment requires the Governor to call a special 44 session for the purpose of redistricting the state's congressional 45 districts in the year following a decennial census. 46 If the special session adjourns without adopting a joint resolution 47 redistricting the congressional districts, a commission composed 48 of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, the Attorney General, 49 the Secretary of State, the Speaker of the House of 50 Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Mississippi 51 Senate is required to convene and redistrict the congressional 52 53 districts."

54 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Attorney General shall 55 submit this resolution, immediately upon adoption by the 56 Legislature, to the Attorney General of the United States or to 57 the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in 58 accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, 59 as amended and extended.

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ST: Amend Constitution; provide a procedure for redistricting congressional districts in the event the Legislature fails to do so.
