## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 560

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE OF ANN LAMBERT  
2 DAVIS AND EXPRESSING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HER FAMILY AND FRIENDS  
3 UPON HER PASSING.

4 WHEREAS, Ann Lambert Davis departed this life on December 6,  
5 2001, causing great loss to her family and friends; and

6 WHEREAS, born in Gastonia, North Carolina, to Coit and Mickey  
7 Lambert, Ann Lambert Davis moved to Vicksburg, Mississippi, in  
8 1962 and graduated from Cooper High School; and

9 WHEREAS, Mrs. Davis attended Mississippi University for Women  
10 and graduated from Mississippi College; and

11 WHEREAS, she married Landon Kimbrough "Kim" Davis and moved  
12 to Clinton, Mississippi, where upon graduation she taught special  
13 education classes at Lovett Elementary School; and

14 WHEREAS, Mrs. Davis was very active in civic affairs, served  
15 as President of the PTA at Clinton Park Elementary and Clinton  
16 Junior High School, President of the Clinton Junior Civic League,  
17 and Legislative Chairman for the Mississippi Federation of Women's  
18 Clubs; and

19 WHEREAS, Mrs. Davis was a member of First United Methodist  
20 Church, Clinton, where she served as Worship Chairman and was  
21 instrumental in establishing kindergarten classes and a cub scout  
22 pack; and

23 WHEREAS, Mrs. Davis was selected as Clinton's Woman of the  
24 Year, 1984, by the Clinton Chamber of Commerce; and

25 WHEREAS, for the past 15 years, Mrs. Davis was Executive  
26 Director of the Independent Nursing Home Association of



27 Mississippi, where she dedicated herself to the improvement of  
28 health care for elderly citizens of the state; and

29 WHEREAS, Mrs. Davis worked tirelessly to help ensure the  
30 highest standard of nursing home care, and the ability of the  
31 nursing home industry to provide such care; and

32 WHEREAS, because of her outstanding reputation for honesty  
33 and integrity, Mrs. Davis was routinely asked by the State  
34 Legislature for information and advice on issues related to health  
35 care legislation; and

36 WHEREAS, Mrs. Davis was appointed by the Governor to serve on  
37 study committees to develop recommendations for improvement of  
38 health care in the state; and

39 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize  
40 the lives of outstanding Mississippians such as Ann Lambert Davis:

41 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF  
42 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That  
43 we do hereby commend the life of Ann Lambert Davis and express the  
44 sympathy of the Legislature on her passing.
