SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 17

A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING COACH JERRY 1 BOATNER OF WEST LAUDERDALE HIGH SCHOOL ON THE OCCASION OF HIS 2 3 INDUCTION INTO THE MISSISSIPPI ASSOCIATION OF COACHES HALL OF FAME 4 CLASS OF 2002. 5 WHEREAS, Coach Jerry Boatner, long-time Coach of West Lauderdale High School, has been selected for induction into the 6 Mississippi Association of Coaches Hall of Fame, Class of 2002; 7 8 and

9 WHEREAS, Jerry Boatner, at age 56, is entering his 29th year as head coach of the Knights. In Coach Boatner's previous 28 10 years, he has led the black and red to an overall record of 757 11 wins and 245 losses. Included in this number are 13 conference 12 championships, 10 state titles, three state runner-up titles, 20 13 district championships and 21 invitational championships; and 14 WHEREAS, In 1993 and 2001, Coach Boatner was named 15 Coach-of-the-Year by the National High School Coaches of America 16 for District Six which includes Alabama, Mississippi, Missouri, 17 Arkansas, Texas and Oklahoma. The National High School Baseball 18 Coaches also awarded him Groundskeeper-of-the-Year in 1992 and 19 1993. Coach Boatner was chosen in 1992 as Baseball 20 Coach-of-the-Year by the United States Baseball Federation. He 21 has been named Conference Coach-of-the-Year 13 times and Area 22 Coach-of-the-Year eight times. In 1994, he was chosen to coach 23 the South Central Team in the State Games. In 1978 and 1990, he 24 was honored by the Mississippi Association of Coaches as 25 26 Coach-of-the-Year. In 1976 and 1996, hw was chosen as the South Coach for the Mississippi High School All-Star Baseball Game. He 27 has also received an award from Delta State University for 28 S. R. coaching achievement. Coach Boatner's 757 wins at West 29 30 Lauderdale, along with 50 wins at Clarkdale, makes him the second 31 winningest baseball coach in Mississippi and the eighth in the nation. He received the Wayne Twink Seyton Award in 1966 for 32 33 Unselfish Love of Baseball. In 1990, he received the Clarion 34 Ledger Coach-of-the-Year. He was inducted into Delta State University Alumni Coaches' Hall of Fame in 1998. In 1999 he was 35 inducted into Crossroad Diamond Baseball Club's Hall of Fame; and 36

37 WHEREAS, one of the greatest honors bestowed upon Coach 38 Boatner was when the people of Clarkdale High School named their 39 baseball field in his honor in 1973. More recently, in 1992 and 40 1993, his West Lauderdale baseball field was named 41 Field-of-the-Year by the National High School Baseball Coaches; 42 and

WHEREAS, Coach Boatner is a 1963 graduate of Meridian High 43 School where he earned eight letters--three in baseball, three in 44 45 track and two in basketball. While attending East Mississippi Junior College, he lettered four more times--two in baseball and 46 two in basketball. He was also a member of the State Champion 47 48 Junior College baseball team in 1965. He is a graduate of Delta State University where he was a two-year letterman in baseball and 49 50 a member of the 1968 baseball team that finished third in the College World Series. He earned a Master's Degree in Education at 51 Delta State in 1971. In 1980, he earned his Education Specialist 52 53 Degree from Mississippi State University. He is a member of Mississippi Association of Coaches, National High School Baseball 54 55 Coaches Association and the American Baseball Coaches Association. He serves as State Chairman for the United States Baseball 56 Federation, and is an associate scout for the Kansas City Royals; 57 58 and

59 WHEREAS, in 1990, he was named Head Softball Coach. In these 60 11 years, he has compiled a record of 432 wins and only 91 losses. 61 Included in these wins are eight district championships, four

Coach Boatner was chosen Softball Coach-of-the-Year and All-Star Coach in 1998 by the Mississippi Association of Coaches and Lauderdale County Coach-of-the-Year in 1993, 1994, 1996 and 1997; and
