## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 33

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE CIVIC DEDICATION OF DELTA SIGMA 2 THETA PUBLIC SERVICE SORORITY AND RECOGNIZING MARCH 9, 2002, AS 3 INTERNATIONAL DAY OF SERVICE.

WHEREAS, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. is an international 4 public service sorority that has chosen the fight against HIV/AIDS 5 in the African American Community as one of its national 6 initiatives for the 2000-2002 biennium. Throughout its history, 7 the sorority has initiated and promoted cutting edge community 8 service programs and projects addressing critical needs in 9 education, economic development and physical and mental health. 10 The newly established International Day of Service spans the 11 Health and International Awareness and Involvement components of 12 13 our Five Point Program. It focuses the attention of the entire sorority on the spread of this epidemic disease that is 14 devastating so many families and communities both in this country 15 and on the African continent; and 16

WHEREAS, with the rampant spread of HIV and AIDS in this 17 18 country and abroad, we face one of the most severe challenges to the stability and longevity of African and African-American 19 20 families. Though advances in medical science have lengthened the 21 average survival time by three years, not all have access to life preserving treatments. Though there is increased knowledge about 22 the disease and individual approaches to prevention, far too many 23 people still believe "It can't happen to me!"; and 24

25 WHEREAS, members of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., have 26 been called to help raise awareness of how each individual can 27 contribute to preventing the spread of this disease by

participating in an International Day of Service. On March 9, 2002, every Delta Chapter is asked to provide a service that supports the awareness of and eradication of this disease through activities that provide for those who are suffering from the ravages of HIV and AIDS; and

The tentative scheduled events are a Run/Walk to benefit 36 services to AIDS victims at the Pediatric HIV Clinic at University 37 Medical Center, a panel discussion on the myths, half truths and 38 truths of AIDS prevention and a concert. All of these events will 39 be held at the Jackson Medical Mall; and

40 WHEREAS, Saturday, March 9, 2002, is the INTERNATIONAL DAY OF SERVICE to combat the spread of HIV/AIDS locally, nationally and 41 Every chapter of Delta Sigma Theta throughout 42 internationally. the world is enjoined to launch or culminate a program or project 43 44 dealing with awareness and education or support for diagnosed 45 victims on that day. Deltas will be seen and heard on that day as advocates for total community support in the fight against the 46 47 spread of HIV/AIDS in all communities, but most particularly in the African American community; and 48

49 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the civic 50 dedication of this service group whose energy is an inspiration to 51 all citizens of the State of Mississippi:

52 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF 53 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commend the civic dedication of 54 Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., Public Service Sorority and 55 recognize March 9, 2002, as International Day of Service to combat 56 the spread of HIV/AIDS locally, nationally and internationally.
