POLLY HOLLOWAY BEVERLY FOR 1 FIFTY YEARS OF DEDICATED SERVICE AS AN EDUCATOR. 2 3 WHEREAS, Mrs. Polly Holloway Beverly served as an educator for fifty years in Jefferson and Claiborne Counties; and 4 WHEREAS, Mrs. Polly Holloway Beverly, the daughter of the 5 late Jesse and Mimie Holloway, was born in Fayette, Mississippi, 6 on January 3, 1910; and 7 8 WHEREAS, Mrs. Polly Holloway Beverly earned her BS degree from Rust College, her MS degree from St. Louis University and her 9 MA degree in Library Science from Atlanta University; and 10 WHEREAS, Mrs. Polly Holloway Beverly was married to her 11 hometown sweetheart, the late Reverend M.R. Beverly, for 55 years; 12 and 13 WHEREAS, they were blessed with one daughter, Camille; and 14 WHEREAS, she started her teaching career in 1917, when she 15 was a young lady just 17 years old; and 16 WHEREAS, she has taught the 1st through 12th grades, coached 17 basketball and taught the 3rd and 4th generations of many 18 families; and 19 WHEREAS, Mrs. Polly Holloway Beverly was the first black 20 librarian in Jefferson County; and 21 WHEREAS, Mrs. Polly Holloway Beverly was the Head Librarian 22 for Claiborne County, where she helped establish and reorganize 23 the Library System at Addison High School; and 24 25 WHEREAS, she was loved by her students as a kind, fair, soft-spoken teacher with a quick smile and affectionately known as 26 "Ms. Polly"; and 27 49 S. WHEREAS, she considers her greatest reward in teaching is to 28 have lived to see so many of her students complete their education 29 30 and become leaders in their communities; and WHEREAS, she was active in professional and civic affairs; 31 32 and WHEREAS, she was a member of the National Education 33 34 Association, MTA, American Library Association, Mississippi Library Association, the American Red Cross, National Federation 35 of Colored Women Clubs and the Mt. Zion Church of God in Christ; 36 37 and 38 WHEREAS, Mrs. Polly Holloway Beverly helped establish and became the first Director of the American Red Cross for Jefferson 39 40 County; and WHEREAS, she is still very active as a youthful 92-year-old, 41 who still loves to travel with her daughter; and 42 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Senate of the State of 43 Mississippi to recognize and commend the dedicated service of the 44 45 citizens of the State of Mississippi: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MISSISSIPPI SENATE, That 46 47 we do hereby commend Mrs. Polly Holloway Beverly for over fifty years of dedicated service to the children of this state as an 48 49 educator.
