## REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

## MR. SPEAKER AND MADAM PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1787: Appropriation; State Department of Health-support.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
8	defraying the expenses of the State Department of Health for the
9	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003
10	\$ 30,351,556.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Department
14	of Health which is comprised of special source funds collected by
15	or otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of
16	defraying the expenses of the department for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003

19	SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be

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the requirements of this provision are met.

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Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance

Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of

the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized

in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the

intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted

performance measures provided below:

157	the funds provided herein, the State Department of Health may
158	provide and administer without charge, Hepatitis B vaccinations to
159	Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel who are in need of such
160	vaccinations through job related exposure.
161	SECTION 9. In addition to all other sums heretofore
162	appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
