REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. SPEAKER AND MADAM PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1801: Appropriation; State Department of Education - General Programs, Education Reform Act and Vocational Education.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

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Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation

Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase

whichever is greater, beginning on January 1, 2003.

SECTION 17. With respect to agency programs whose operation is dependent on the receipt of federal funds, it is the intent of the Legislature, except as hereinafter provided, that no funds from the State General Fund be expended to administer, support or in any way continue such programs should federal funds for their operation be reduced or become unavailable and that no funds from the State General Fund available for expenditure under this act shall be used to replace federal funds in any major object of expenditure.

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     provide funding to defray the costs of psychological evaluations

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     report to the State Department of Education all expulsions of

     students as authorized under Section 6 of Senate Bill No. 2239,
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     2001 Regular Session. The State Department of Education shall
     annually report to the Legislature by January of each year.
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          SECTION 26. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 9 and 10,
     an amount not to exceed One Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars
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     ($1,300,000.00) shall be used for technological methods for

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          SECTION 27. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, an
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     amount not to exceed One Million Eight Hundred Seventy-six

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     from the State Department of Education to the Mississippi National
     Guard for the support of the Youth Challenge Program at Camp

     Shelby.
          SECTION 28. It is the intention of the Legislature that at
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     least Twenty-one Million Dollars ($21,000.000.00) be expended for
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     textbooks as defined in Section 37-43-1. The State Department of
     Education shall report to the Legislature the amount of
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     expenditures for each school district no later than October 31,
     2003.
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          SECTION 29. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
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     the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
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     credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
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     warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
     Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
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     proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
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SECTION 30. This act shall take effect and be in force from

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and after July 1, 2002.
